Knoxville Raceway - Knoxville, Iowa - April 25, 2003 World of Outlaws Knoxville Spring Opener Preliminary Events

(Lasoski Captures Knoxville WoO Spring Opener Prelim)

Danny Lasoski, the seven-time Knoxville Raceway track champion and the 2001 World of Outlaws Champion (WoO), captured the preliminary feature event of the WoO Spring

Opener at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. The event also marked the season opener of this world famous race facility which will celebrate its 50th anniversary during the year.

Lasoski, who started on the outside of the front row of the 25-lap feature event, led the entire distance except for the opening circuit which was owned by pole sitter Kerry Madsen. After that first lap as Madsen and Lasoski dashed past the start finish line, Madsen went high into the first turn while Lasoski took the low route. That was all that was needed as "the Dude" forged into the lead heading into the second turn and never relinquished the top spot. One lap later Donny Schatz grabbed second from Madsen and the chase was on to see if he could catch the fleet Lasoski.

At lap seven Lasoski entered lap traffic with Schatz trailing about a full straight-away in the distance as Steve Kinser too fell into the chase. Even the backmarkers did not hinder the Tony Stewart Motor Sports Eagle as Schatz was unable to make up any of the distance at this point. At the five-mile mark when Lasoski entered heavy lap traffic, Schatz could not put a dent in the gap.

Of interest to most fans was where Lasoski would run on the famous half-mile oval as the track had two distinct grooves on it: the bottom and the top. For Lasoski it seemed to make no difference as his sprinter handled well where ever he put it. Schatz too seemed able to place his car in either groove and perform well from that spot.

While Lasoski and Schatz were involved in the run for first place, Kinser and Tim Shaffer were in an equal duel of their own for the third spot. Shaffer was never able to claim that spot although he made several bids on the Kinser machine. However with just five laps to go Kinser had pulled away and secured his finish in the event.

What looked to be a flag to flag race suddenly changed its complexion as Madsen who was running sixth and Tyler Walker who was challenging in seventh banged wheels coming out of turn four on the completion of the twenty-third lap. Walker received the worst of it as the California driver spun his sprinter to a stop on the front stretch and was relegated to the rear for the single-file restart.

When the race resumed, Lasoski utilized the lap cars between himself and Schatz to place a wide gap between the two front runners and came across the finish line for his 79th feature event win here. The victory paid the Missouri native \$5,000. In the cool-down lap after the win Lasoski parked his sprinter on the backstretch and later explained in victory lane that the engine had "let go" as he took the checkered flag.

Schatz was second, Kinser took third, Shaffer claimed fourth and Brooke Tatnell finished fifth. Travis Cram, Craig Dollansky, Madsen, Johnny Herrera and P.J. Chesson rounded out the top ten as several places changed during the final two-lap restart dash.

Danny Lasoski made Knoxville Raceway history when he claimed his 80th (all-time leading here) feature event on this storied oval and captured the World of Outlaws (WoO) Spring Opener at the Marion County Fairgrounds Saturday night. The win also marked back to back wins as "the Dude" also was victorious in the Friday night qualifier. The seven-time Knoxville Raceway track champion was paid \$12,000 for first place finish.

Lasoski, who started on the pole of the 30-lap feature event, dove to the low side of turns one and two at the beginning of the

race with fellow front row starter Donny Schatz in pursuit. As they hit turns three and four Lasoski utilized the high cushion leading Schatz across the start-finish line to claim the first lap. This route would be Lasoski's road to victory as he toured the famous Knoxville half-mile in the same fashion when ever the track was clear in that direction. This line of racing created a 20-car length advantage by the fifth circuit as Schatz, Steve Kinser, and Tim Shaffer tried varied approaches to catch the Lasoski Eagle on a track which had become extremely 'slicked-over'. But for all intents and purposes the Jimmy Carr prepared machine had begun checking out on the field as he hit lap traffic on the seventh go around in a car that performed brilliantly anywhere on the track.

At the five-mile mark, Lasoski had built a lead of nearly a straight away. It was also at this point that Kinser performed a perfect slide job on Schatz in turns three and four to take the runner up spot. Three laps later Schatz regained the position, forcing Kinser to chase him to the finish of the race.

By lap twenty it had become obvious that no one would catch the Tony Stewart Motorsports sprinter unless something unusual happened. Schatz had fallen far back and was unable to pick up any of the distance. Lap 22 saw the caution flag come out for a two-car incident on the front stretch. With that the cars began to realign for a single file restart. The question in everyone's mind was how many lapped cars would be placed between Lasoski and Schatz. As it turned out five sprinters were placed between the two frontrunners and when the green flew once again Lasoski shot away from the field like a bullet.

With Schatz now hindered by the slower sprinters, the race was truly Lasoski's to lose. "The Dude" did not disappoint his fans as he continued to show the field his tail tank and came across the finish line nearly one quarter of a lap ahead of Schatz. Kinser held his third place spot with Mark Kinser giving one his strongest showings of the season for fourth. Shaffer rounded out the top five finishers. Daryn Pitman, Knoxville regular

Terry McCarl, Tyler Walker who started nineteenth, Joey Saldana, and Jeff Shepard completed the top ten finishers.

Heat races were captured by Craig Dollansky, Mark Kinser, Kerry Madsen and Chris Walraven. C and B features went to Randy Martin and Joey Saldana respectively. Saldana had to report to the B after suffering front end damage in his heat race. In qualifying time trials Mark Kinser nearly eclipsed the one-lap track record with a quick lap of 15.025.

The companion 360 sprints saw David Hesmer pick up his 58th (division leading) feature event win in a 15-lap race in which he led flag to flag. The initial start to the event saw five cars eliminated in a turn two skirmish of two separate incidents. Once the race restarted Hesmer was able to control his position even though a lone yellow flag slowed the pace. Hesmer, who is a four-time division champion here, ran the cushion the entire distance and only caught lap traffic as he took the checkered flags. He was trailed the entire distance by Jesse Giannetto. Third went to tenth starting Stacey Alexander, Mike Houseman claimed fourth and Brett Golik finished fifth.

Knoxville Raceway - Knoxville, Iowa - May 3, 2003 (Jackson and Giannetto Are Knoxville Victors) by Bob Wilson



Skip Jackson and Jesse Giannetto each captured feature event wins at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night as this Central Iowa racing facility began its regular season of competition. Jackson scored \$3,000 with his 410 division win and Giannetto took home \$1,250 on the 360 side of it.

The outset of the 410 feature event saw pole-sitter Mike Reinke grab the lead which he extended to about ten car lengths early. The single file restart found Reinke holding his top spot on the big half-mile oval as Jackson made a pass of Wayne Johnson to take the runner-up spot. That was the way the top three ran until

the eighth circuit when Jackson dove low in turns one and two and Reinke stayed high on the cushion. Running down the back chute Jackson became the new leader and this time he chose to run the high line to block any Reinke bid on the cushion of the track.

Just as Jackson entered lap traffic the yellow flag came out and once more the cars reported to the flagstand in a single file running order. Three additional yellow flags plagued the race and each time Reinke found the sprinter he was piloting to be sluggish on the restarts. This factor gave Jackson a unique advantage as he was able to scoot out to a nice margin before all cars behind him made it to speed.

It was on a lap 15 restart in which a third-running Blake Feese charged to second and began to pick up on the chase of the front running JTR Motorsports machine. Feese stayed within five car lengths of the Jackson sprinter as Jackson, the 1997 and 1998 track champion rode the low side of the track in turns one and two and Feese stayed on top.

The fifth and final yellow occurred on the 17th go around and on the restart Feese was able to stay in contact with Jackson's J & J. Each tour of the dirt oval saw Feese getting closer, especially when the two went through the first and second turns. Then on the last lap, Feese actually passed Jackson coming out of the second turn and had the lead heading into the final two turns. But the win was not to be for Feese as Jackson performed a perfect slide job going into turn three and reclaimed the lead from the cushion riding Feese. At the finish line Jackson was no more than a car length in front of Feese for the win.

Jackson's win here was his twenty-first, tying him with the legendary Eddie Leavitt.

Terry McCarl, a sixth row starter, did a masterful job to finish third, Johnson held for fourth and Calvin Landis, who started along side McCarl was fifth. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Justin Henderson, Brent Antill who started dead last in the 22-car field, Brian Brown, Reinke and Travis Cram.

In the companion 360 sprints, Giannetto took a seventh lap lead from race-long leader Joe Beaver when he utilized the low



groove in turns one and two to grab that top spot from Beaver who was on the cushion. Once in the lead, Giannetto checked out on the rest of the field to take the win. Beaver kept the runner up spot, Ryan York was

third and Steve Breazeale finished fourth. Mike Houseman, who started fourteenth drove all the way forward to take fifth.

According to National Speed Sport News editor emeritus Chris Economaki, the term "doodlebug" was created by the "big car" gentry in the late 1930's for the increasingly-popular "midget" car. Walter Bull, who founded the Illustrated Speedway News, then started a contest to crown "King Doodlebug". According to National Sprint Car Museum board members Larry Ball, Jr., and Bill Hill, the following six drivers were all crowned "King Doodlebug": Cletus "Cowboy" O'Rourke (1938), Bill Holmes (1939), Al Bonnell (1946), Ed "Dutch" Schaefer (1947), Bill Schindler (1948), and Ralph Pratt (1949).

KNOXVILLE RACEWAY - MAY 31st DEWEASE & HAMILTON CELEBRATE AT KNOXVILLE; DESELLE PULLS OFF MIDGET THRILLER

Pennsylvania car owner Al Hamilton came to Knoxville this weekend with 26 family members and his red number 77 sprint car team. He went home with a prestigious National Sprint Car Hall of Fame induction plaque and an extra \$3,000 after his driver, Lance Dewease, earned his first sprint car feature win at the historic dirt track.

Four-time Knoxville Raceway point champion Terry McCarl spun the number 24 machine between turns three and four on the opening lap of the A-Main. The spin sent McCarl to the tail. On the restart, Knoxville regular Kerry Madsen took the early

lead.

With six laps down, Aussie racer Brooke Tatnell stopped in the backstretch causing a yellow flag. On the restart, Madsen once again led the field. By lap eight, eleventh place starter Dewease had claimed the number two spot. On the next circuit, Dewease began challenging Madsen for the lead. The two racers battled side by side for the next several laps.

Following the completion of the sixteenth lap, Dewease became the front runner with a hard-charging Madsen on his tail. Meanwhile, McCarl had battled his way up to the third position. Dewease hung on for his first career Knoxville Raceway victory, with Madsen close behind. McCarl, Jeff Mitrisin and Calvin Landis, rounded out the top five, respectively.

"This win means a lot to me and this is special for this man over here," Dewease stated as he pointed to proud car owner Al Hamilton.

Posting quick time for the evening was Blake Feese in Guy Forbrook's number 5 sprinter with a time of 15.183 seconds. Forbrook drew the number 12 pill for the inversion. Winning the four heat races were Don Droud, Jr., Larry Ball, Jr., Ricky Logan and Lynton Jeffrey. The top four drivers in the B-Main, transferred to the A. Winning the 'B' was Justin Henderson. Also transferring were Wayne Johnson, Brent Antill and Mike Reinke.

The 25-lap, \$4,000 to win Pepsi/Mt. Dew Knoxville Midget Championship race was won by Chad DeSelle,

who started in the thirteenth position.

The early leader was defending Knoxville midget champion Mike Hess, who led the first nine circuits before relinquishing the lead to Aaron Fiscus. Fiscus remained in control until he was passed by Don Droud Jr., who started seventeenth in the field. However, Droud's lead was short lived as a fuel line problem forced him out of contention in the frontstretch as a yellow was thrown.

With four laps to go, on the restart, Ray Bull and Davey Ray tangled as Bull spun in the backstretch due to a broken front end.



On the next restart, Fiscus took the lead once again with Hess and DeSelle in hot pursuit. DeSelle decided to run the high side as most of his competitors ran low. The choice to run the high side paid off as DeSelle went on for the win by leading the final two laps for his first Knoxville midget win and his sixth career midget feature win.

Fiscus and Hess finished second and third, respectively. Rounding out the top five were Aaron Fike and Damion Gardner, respectively. Friday night's "King Doodlebug" champion Craig Carey finished sixth.

Winning the two B-Main's were Brandon Waelti and Aaron Fike. The Dash winner was Mike Hess.

Knoxville Raceway - June 13, 2003 (Higday and Adams Take Preliminary Feature Event Wins At 360 Nationals) By Bob Wilson

Local talent Josh Higday of nearby Des Moines and Floridian Kenny Adams captured feature events wins during the Friday night preliminary action of the 13th annual Advance Auto Parts 360 Knoxville Nationals. Higday had won a regular Saturday night feature event here this season. Adams was racing on Knoxville soil for the very first time.

Higday led all 20 laps in capturing his side of the double feature event program. He started on the front row and made quick work of fellow front row starter Cody Branchcomb. Running the cushion, Higday rapidly forged a substantial lead on the half-mile dirt oval. Erin Crocker fell in behind Higday but was unable to keep pace with him and slowly drifted backward in her runner-up spot. Chasing her was Brian Brown, Knoxville's 360 track champion in 2002.

At the five-mile point, Higday had driven to a tremendous lead as he had built a full straight away advantage over Crocker. Following

those two were Shane Stewart, Brown and Travis Rilat.

Lap fourteen seemed to be a pivotal circuit in this race as that was the lap that Crocker began to slow as the frontrunners entered into heavy lap traffic. First Stewart passed the Massachusetts driver and one lap later Brown too made a pass. It was later learned that the Crocker sprinter had suffered a loss of power steering.

With five laps to go, Higday had checked out on the field in his self-owned Eagle-Ostrich. Stewart was able to make a small dent in the huge Higday lead but it was to no avail as the ten-mile sprint went non-stop in track record time with Higday claiming the \$2,000 winner's check while Stewart took second. Brown, who finished third, was later disqualified during tech inspection and was relegated to twentieth. Rilat was awarded third, Crocker took fourth and fifth went to Don Droud, Jr.

The second feature event appeared to be a victim of this Friday-the-thirteenth race date. The race was not one

lap old and two red flags quieted the engines. Four additional yellows and a third red made it seem as if this race was not to be run.

Except for the first circuit, Kenny Adams held the point position for most of the race. The second circuit saw him dive below leader Steve Breazeale in turns one and two and take the lead going down the backstretch. Unlike the first feature event, this race would not be a runaway win for Adams as Billy Alley stayed right with the fleet Floridian.



The final caution flag of the event flew on lap seven as multi-time Knoxville track champion Terry McCarl slowed dramatically going into turn one while running third. McCarl could not restart and exited the race.

When the race resumed, Alley continued his chase of the Ott-powered Shaw chassis in front of him. With Adams running the high side Alley tried a different route as he cruised the low groove of the track not less than five car lengths to the rear. Lap fourteen saw the two cars come across the finish line nearly even. Laps 15 and 16 belonged to Alley but on the next go around Adams reclaimed the lead as both cars were running in heavy lap traffic.

In the end Adams claimed the \$2,000 payday by nearly twenty car lengths in the Goodson Farms sprinter, the same car which captured the event title in 2002. Alley came across the line second while Randy Martin, and Jake Peters finished strong in third and fourth. Dennis Moore, Jr. claimed fifth after coming from the tail of the field.

A total of 75 cars from thirteen states and Canada went through the paces of this initial night of qualifying.

Knoxville Raceway - June 14, 2003 13th Advance Auto Parts 360 Knoxville Nationals American Sprint Car Series

Dennis Moore, Jr. made the long drive from California pay off as the native Iowan pulled off a surprising win during the 13th annual Advance Auto Parts 360 Knoxville Nationals. It was Moore's second victory in this Nationals event, the first coming in 1999.

The start of the 25-lap championship event saw front row starter Don Droud, Jr. trade slide jobs with pole sitter Travis Rilat to take lap number one. With a track that had developed two grooves, drivers had to choose either the top or the bottom of the big half mile oval. For Droud, the top proved to be the fast way


around and when the first caution flew on lap eight for a stalled car, he had pulled out to a tremendous lead.

On the restart Droud and Rilat again traded slides but just like the initial start, Droud again came out in front. There he stayed until a second caution flew on lap eleven for yet another stalled car. During the slow down laps of the single file realignment the Droud sprinter suddenly slowed and stalled in turn two right in front of the National Sprint Car Hall of Fame. The car was pushed to the pits where it was learned that it had lost its quick change gears, ending Droud's evening.

Rilat then inherited the top spot but was challenged by Josh Higday who had won one of Friday's qualifying features. At the completion of fifteen laps Higday was no more than five-car lengths behind the front runner. Also in this mix were Randy Martin, Moore, Jr. and brothers Darren and Shane Stewart.

As the race edged past the 20 lap mark, it looked to be a Rilat win as he rode the cushion through lap traffic. Suddenly from no where, running the bottom groove, Moore roared into second. On the 22nd go around he used the same groove to take the Doug Brown Eagle-Ostrich to the front, much to the amazement of the grandstand

crowd. Perhaps more amazingly, once in front, Moore was able to guide his mount away from the field to take the \$6,000 first place prize money by a margin of 30-car lengths. The win would have to rank as one of the more stunning upsets and wins ever seen at this storied Iowa oval. Moore later said that he felt that the top groove had slowed down and that he just happed to be on the bottom when that happened. Rilat took home the \$3,000 second place check while Higday was third and was paid \$2,500. In the battle of the Stewart brothers, Shane outdistanced Darren as they finished fourth and fifth respectively. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Randy Martin, Kenny Adams, Billy Alley, Jesse Giannetto and John VanDenBerg.

Travis Cram made his front row starting position pay off as he led all 20 laps of the feature event at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. The win was Cram's first this year and his third overall at this Central Iowa racing facility.

At the start of the race, Cram and fellow front row starter Wayne Johnson traded slide jobs in turns one and two and again in turns three and four with Cram coming out on top on the first lap of the sprint car ballet. Two distinct grooves were available for the evening: the cushion near the big white fences or the bottom. Both Cram and Johnson chose the top in which to attack the half mile oval.



With five laps gone in the race, Cram had built a twenty car length advantage. Before he had reached the half way point of the race he had entered lap traffic and began to handle the backmarkers with ease. He was still being chased at a distance by Johnson who in turn had Kerry Madsen on his back bumper. Shane Stewart completed the foursome that appeared to be the major players of the race.

Having entered lap traffic early in the race meant that Cram would have to fight his way to the finish with the backmarkers in his midst. By lap fifteen he had forged a comfortable twenty car length lead over Johnson as he moved with ease through the slower cars. Even near the end of the race when Cram headed into heavy lap traffic he had no difficulty managing his way.

In the end, Cram was not to be denied as he took his self-owned J&J-Ott to the \$3,000 victory lane. Johnson, Stewart, Madsen and Jaymie Moyle followed in that order. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Justin Henderson, Skip Jackson, Don Droud, Jr., Brian Brown and Ricky Logan.

(Cram Repeats While Alley Grabs First Knoxville Feature)

Travis Cram raced to rare back-to-back feature event wins as rookie Billy Alley captured his first A Main at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night.

For Cram, it was no certainty in the front part of the 20-lap feature event as pole sitter Wayne Johnson grabbed the top spot at the drop of the green flag. Johnson roared around the half-mile oval on the high cushion with Cram in tow at a distance of fifteen car lengths. Cram was able to cut into that margin slightly as the two drivers sped wide open around this historic fairgrounds track.

Just as the front-running duo headed into lap traffic and the race looked to become interesting, the yellow flag flew for a spun car on the track. The restart advantage belonged to Johnson with Cram following in hot pursuit. At the half-way point the second caution of the event was displayed for another spun sprinter.

Johnson again showed the way on the restart through turns one and two but when he and Cram headed into turn three, Cram soared to the bottom of the track and slid up in front of the Johnson machine going into four. With that pass Cram had secured the lead which he would not relinquish for the rest of the race.

While the Cram and Johnson battle was going on, Terry McCarl had quietly move from his eighth position start to a solid third place position. Behind McCarl a gigantic battle broke out for the fourth spot with Brian Brown, Skip Jackson, Ricky Logan, Kerry Madsen and Mike Reinke. Lap after lap positions shifted and changed but were not settled until the checkered flag.

At the stripe it was Cram in his self-owned J&J-Ott by five car lengths over McCarl as Johnson held for third. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Jackson, Madsen, Brown, Logan, Reinke, Don Droud, Jr. and Jeff Mitrisin from the tail.

In the companion 360 feature event, Billy Alley grabbed a fourth lap lead from Michael Jones with a slide job in turns three and four. With the lead secured, Alley cruised out to a 20 car-length lead as he rode the cushion on the big half-mile oval.

Just when he was ready to enter a large contingent of lap traffic, a caution flag flew for Josh Higday who had stopped on the front chute. He was unable to restart.

When the race resumed, Alley continued to ride the cushion but this time he had some fast company as Matt Moro tried to slide



him in turns one and two. As they roared down the backstretch side by side it was a drag race to see who would have the advantage heading into the third turn. Both cars entered the turn side by side with Alley nearly climbing the inside berm but reclaiming the lead as they shot into turn four. Once in front again and with the Moro threat at bay, Alley guided the Ray Lipsey owned Eagle-Wesmar in the final five laps to his very first Knoxville Raceway feature event win.

Moro came across the stripe in second, Larry Ball, Jr. took third, Jesse Giannetto was fourth and Joe Beaver scored a fifth place finish. A total of forty 360 and thirty-seven 410 sprinters competed on the evening.

Knoxville Raceway - June 28 (Veterans McCarl and Hesmer are Top Dogs at Knoxville Midseason) By Bob Wilson



The top two drivers at Knoxville Raceway with a combined total of 91 career feature event wins, stole the show at the Marion County Fairgrounds Saturday night. Terry McCarl (32 wins) and David Hesmer (59 wins) each grabbed feature event wins at this central Iowa race facility's Midseason Championships.

McCarl, who started 12th in the 25 lap 410 feature event, moved rapidly through the field to run in the third spot when the first caution flag flew on lap eight. Up to that point, pole sitter Randy Martin had roared out to a 25 car length lead as he placed his sprinter on the cushion and drove flat out. On the restart McCarl took the runner-up spot away from Jaymie

Moyle and proceeded to begin his chase-down of Martin.

With Martin still on the cushion, McCarl too utilized that high line through turns one and two but dove to the low side of the track through turns three and four. It was this strategy in the final two turns of lap thirteen that paid off for McCarl as he and Martin drag-raced out of turn four. As they crossed the start-finish line McCarl's low line showed him to edge Martin by a matter of a few feet.

Once in front, McCarl had the field covered although he had to endure a caution-flag slowdown and a single file restart on lap fourteen. With that out of the way, McCarl quickly soared to a 30 car length lead while a mad scramble developed to see who would garner the runner-up spot.

The battle to watch seemed to be the Brian Brown/Justin Henderson skirmish. Both young drivers worked their machines to the limit as first one driver 'slid' the other and then the favor was returned in the next turn. The battle continued until Henderson finally got the upper hand just before the twentieth circuit. It was just after that point that Brown began to slide slowly backwards with some kind of problems with his sprinter.

At the end of the 25 lap event, McCarl drove his self-owned Wesmar-Eagle under the checkered flags with Henderson just exiting turn four. Skip Jackson, who started 19th came across the stripe for third and Ricky Logan, a row seven starter finished fourth. Fifth went to Don Droud, Jr. who started dead last in the twenty-two car field. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Moyle, Wayne Johnson, Brent Antill, Martin and Lynton Jeffrey.

In the 360 Mid-Season Championship, David Hesmer led the entire 18 lap distance in a race that went flag to flag. Hesmer, who started on the pole rapidly ran out to a big lead as he raced the cushion on the big halfmile oval. Chasing Hesmer was Brett Golik who was unable to keep the pace in second place.



By lap four Hesmer had cruised to a 25 car length advantage. Eric Mason followed Golik in third, Mike Houseman was in fourth and Josh Higday held down the fourth position. With the cushion the fast way around and with no caution flags to slow the race and bunch the cars, Hesmer continued to pull away in the Action Auto Parts Eagle-Parker.

At the half-way point Hesmer held a tremendous margin of nearly thirty car lengths. Shortly after that he entered lap traffic and his margin held firm. Billy Alley, a fifth row starter, had methodically driven his way to second by lap ten. Although Alley appeared to be the fastest car on the track, he did not have enough time to catch the Hesmer machine. Those two drivers crossed the finish line in that order. Third went Golik, Mason claimed a person best with fourth and Houseman completed the top five finishers.

In trackside ceremonies during the evening four new members were installed into the Knoxville Raceway Hall of Fame. New members were Ralph Parkinson, Sr., Jack Herwehe, Clifford "Froggy" Droz and Rocky Hodges.

Knoxville Raceway - July 4th, 2003 (Kinser Takes Independence Day WoO Knoxville Prelim) By Bob Wilson

Steve Kinser provided the fireworks at Knoxville Raceway Friday night as he drove to his 56th victory at this central Iowa oval during the World of Outlaws two-day July 4th weekend preliminary feature event.

Kinser, who started on the pole by virtue of winning his dash event, out drag-raced fellow front row starter and Knoxville regular Ricky Logan at the start of the 25-lap event. Once in the lead Kinser drove his number eleven machine to the cushion and came across the finish line of the first lap with Jason Meyer and Logan on his heals. He was not able to pull away from the field

during this portion of the race. A lap four caution for a stopped Johnny Herrera bunched the field together for a single file restart.

When the race resumed, Kinser held his position but it was Danny Lasoski who was ready to light a few fireworks of his own as he slid past Meyer in turns one and two to claim the runner-up spot. It was then a matter of running the race out to see what Lasoski could do about the man in front of him, 'King Kinser'.

With Lasoski trying to run down Kinser, some fans were intent on watching a wild battle for 6th which had developed between Tim Shaffer and Joey Saldana. As it turned out it was a battle that would run for the length of the event and would not be settled until the end of the race.

On lap ten Kinser entered lap traffic. At first it did not hinder him as the backmarkers had strung themselves out at the five-mile mark. By lap fifteen Lasoski caught the Kinser Maxim. Both drivers edged through the lap cars with great skill on the big half mile oval with Lasoski just one car length behind. Behind them Meyer was set to attack should one or both falter. Running in fourth and fifth were two Knoxville regulars, Ricky Logan and Kerry Madsen.

Lap 18 saw the two front runners head into heavy lap traffic. As they shot past the flagstand Lasoski dove low in turn one and drifted to the cushion just in front of Kinser. Kinser hit the breaks hard allowing the 'Dude' to take the lead. As Kinser gathered his sprinter back together, he and Brian Brown, a lapped car, came together

and Brown ended up spinning to a stop. The yellow flag came out and since lap nineteen was not completed, the field of 24 cars had to revert back to the last completed lap. That lap showed Kinser as the leader and so the Lasoski pass was negated.

With little more than a trophy dash left in the event, Kinser was able to keep control of the race by running on the cushion which had been good to him the entire race. He crossed the finish line no more than ten car lengths ahead of Lasoski to take the win. Meyer, who ran third from the sixth lap finished in that position. Fourth went to Shaffer on a late race pass of Logan. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Saldana, Madsen, Daryn Pitman, Terry McCarl and Danny Wood. McCarl was placed behind the eightball early in the evening during his heat race. The Knoxville points leader who had set fast time in qualifying time trials had wrecked hard in his heat race after a Saldana bump into Calvin Landis at the start of that event led to both Knoxville regulars taking vicious rides. McCarl was able to repair his sprinter in time to take fourth in the B Main, qualifying him for a

ninth row start in the A Main.

In the 360 sprint feature event, Matt Moro led the distance to take his second career win in that division. He was chased throughout the 15-lap race by Joe Beaver.

Lap eleven proved to be the pivotal lap in this event as sixth row starter Billy Alley, who had driven his way to third, was sent to the infield for a safety check during a slow-down caution period. It was determined that he could not continue on without repairs to his car which automatically sent him to the tail once the race resumed.



When the event restarted Moro was able to keep his self-owned Twister in front to take the \$1,250 to win event. Beaver maintained his second spot at the finish while Jesse Giannetto, another sixth row starter took third. Rounding out the top five were Michael Jones and Ed Ergenbright. Josh Higday, Doug Wilson, Mike Houseman, Brett Golik and Alley completed the top ten finishers.

Knoxville Raceway - July 5th, 2003 (The Dude Does it in World of Outlaws Knoxville Action) By Bob Wilson



They say you can never go home, but it seems like every time Danny Lasoski comes to his home track at Knoxville Raceway he appears to make it worth his while. Saturday night it was worth \$20,000 to him as he captured the World of Outlaws midsummer classic at this historic Iowa oval.

The forty-lap feature, the longest of the season here, was only one lap old when those in the stands knew they were in for a memorable race. With Steve Kinser and Lasoski starting side by side on the front row, Kinser out-dragged the "Dude" as they came out of turn four to take the green flag. At the end of the

first lap it was a near dead heat as those two came past the start-finish line. Kinser was given the first lap but Lasoski was so close that as they headed into the first and second turns, he was able to take the lead and extend it to 20 car lengths by lap four. The groove that he found to his liking was to run high in turns one and two and the head to the bottom in three and four. It was a line around the half-mile oval that the seven-time Knoxville Raceway track champion would take each lap if it was open to his Stewart Eagle.

The event saw only two caution flags displayed, the first being just after the leaders came across the finish line on lap six for a stopped car right at the scoreboard between turns three and four. On the restart, Kinser stayed close but the battle was behind him as Tyler Walker and Terry McCarl began a torrid battle for the third place spot. Walker finally won the spot but it was not an easy victory.

At the five-mile mark Lasoski was able to hold a ten car length advantage over Kinser with Walker closing on the second place car. Walker had found the high cushion to his liking and had been able to close the gap on Kinser. On the 16th circuit, Walker pulled along side Kinser on the backstretch and stayed even with the "King" through turns three and four but edged past him as they roared by the flag stand. The next lap saw Kinser regain that spot only to lose it again on the next go around in heavy lap traffic. Although the Kinser-Walker battle for second seemed to be settled at the halfway point of the race, it would prove to not be played out until late in the race. Behind them, two local drivers, McCarl and Kerry Madsen, were having a skirmish of their own. Madsen had made a pass of the McCarl sprinter on lap seventeen. McCarl faltered a bit, then began a methodical run down to re-pass Madsen that would take him nearly the rest of the race.

It was just past the half way point in that heavy lap traffic that Walker came within five car lengths of the fleet Lasoski machine. As the laps began to wind down, Lasoski again pulled away and with thirty laps in the books he could count a fifteen car length advantage. Kinser was staying close in third and on lap thirty-four McCarl was able to get by Madsen for good.

The second caution flag came out on lap 37 for a stalled car in turn two. The single file restart saw Lasoski again pull away as a lap car was between him and second running Walker. McCarl made a pass of Kinser to take third as the twelve-time Knoxville Nationals champion began to fade with tire problems. Kinser would in fact loose the tire completely on the final lap as it blew apart in the first turn. He was able to control his sprinter and guided it on around the track to take a 13th place finish at final tally.

Walker poured on the steam in a vain attempt to catch Lasoski but in the end settled for the \$10,000 second place paycheck. Local standout McCarl took third and \$5,000 while sixteenth starter Donny Schatz collected \$4,000 for fourth. Madsen was fifth and received \$3,5000. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Paul McMahan, Tim Shaffer, Jason Meyer, Joey Saldana and Randy Hannagan.

Terry McCarl, Brent Antill and Ryan York each won feature events at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. McCarl and Antill won 410 features during the annual Twin Features Night and York captured the 360 end for that division.

In the first Twin Feature, Kerry Madsen got the jump on fellow front row starter McCarl to take the lead in the early going of the 20-lap event. Madsen chose the low line around the big half-mile oval with McCarl testing the track in several lines. At the end of five laps McCarl trailed by only five car lengths.

It was about at this point in the race that Madsen changed lines to run high which McCarl had settled on too. As the front running duo headed into lap eight they were running nose to tail. McCarl made several challenges for the lead on the ensuing laps but Madsen was able to fend off those advances. At the half way point of the tenmile event all eyes focused on the top two as they came across the line nose to tail. A red flag on the thirteenth circuit slowed the field and the restart saw a two-car pileup in turns one and two involving Eric Vanderploeg and Wayne Johnson.

As the cars pushed off for the single file restart it the Madsen sprinter failed to fire. He was pushed to the infield and sat out the rest of the race.

McCarl then inherited the lead and went on to capture the win, his 35th here, tying him with Randy Smith for sixth on the all-time list here. Don Droud, Jr. took the runner-up spot and Ricky Logan was third. Clint Garner finished fourth and Brian Brown came across the line for fifth.

The inverted second feature found Jon Agan on the pole and in the lead at the drop of the green flag. Agan built

as much as a twenty car length lead at the half way point by running the cushion of the track. At this point he was trailed by Antill, Travis Cram and Derek Beckman. The drivers who had finished in the front of the first feature were battling to the front but were by no means a threat at this point.

With a wide open track and no lap traffic, several cars began to move forward. With just five laps to go Calvin Landis, Randy Anderson and Terry McCarl had entered the top six running order. It was also at this time that Agan began to miss his line in turns three and four allowing Antill a chance to make up some of



the difference. Coming out of the fourth turn on lap 18, Antill was able to overtake the Agan machine and gain the lead.

Antill then held that spot to the finish to claim his sixth career win here. Agan held for second and McCarl, who had started 15th took third. Landis registered fourth and Cram rounded out the top five finishers.



The 360 feature event proved to be an exciting affair with rookie Ryan York taking his first career win here. Johnny Anderson led at the outset of the 15 lap event as York immediately took up the chase from his second row starting nod. Billy Alley, a fifth row starter, and a double feature winner the previous week, was bogged down in traffic and unable to become a factor in this one.

Just as lap eight was completed, the caution flag was thrown for debris on the track. The single file restart saw York grab the lead from Anderson as the twosome ran down the back chute, with York high and Anderson low. One lap later Josh Higday came

into the picture having taken second from Anderson. Higday's charge from the third row saw him fall right on the back bumper of York with the laps waning.

On the white flag lap Higday performed a perfect slide maneuver in turns one and two to grab the lead, but York compensated by diving low and pulling along side of Higday as the two charged down the backstretch. Roaring into turn three, York gained a very slight advantage as they headed side by side through the turn. Entering the final curve, York made his advantage count as the youngster pulled ahead of Higday and pulled away on the front stretch to win by the slightest of margins. Higday, John VanDenBerg, Anderson and Eric Mason completed the top five finishers.

Travis Cram and Josh Higday each won feature events Saturday night at Knoxville Raceway at the conclusion of the annual Marion County Fair. For both drivers it marked their third win on the season here.

Cram started in the second row of the 20-lap A Feature and somehow found an opening in turns one and two to shoot between the front row starters to take the lead. At the two-mile mark he had developed a 12-car length lead on second place Kerry Madsen. While Cram toured the big half mile on the top, Madsen experimented with different lines in an effort to find the

fastest route.

Just as Cram entered lap traffic at the end of the seventh circuit, a red flag flew for a one-car incident bringing the race to a halt. The restart saw Cram again shoot away from the field as he roared to a 20-car length advantage at the half-way mark. At this point Chris Walraven had made a pass of Madsen with Wayne Johnson in fourth and visiting Johnny Herrera in fifth.

To indicate his intentions, Cram extended his lead in the second half of the event and pulled away to a huge margin even though he again hit lap traffic on the fourteenth go around. Even though the track had developed into a hard, dry slick surface, Cram was able to deftly wind his way through the backmarkers without getting into any problems.

When the checkered flag flew for the Washington state native, Cram had guided his self-owned J & J/Ott to a convincing victory over the 24-car field. Logan scored a season's best with a runner-up place and Walraven was third, a season's best for him too. Madsen took fourth and Herrera was fifth. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Jeff Mitrisin, Skip Jackson, Wayne Johnson, Colin Northway and John Sernett. Season points leader Terry McCarl was eleventh after having started from the tail, a victim of engine problems during heat race qualifications.

In the 360 division, Josh Higday utilized his front row starting position to grab the lead, a position he would not relinquish during the 15-lap feature event. He was chased in the early going by Rob Edwards and then by David Hesmer. Though he had those two cars after him, Higday rode the high cushion against Knoxville's high fences and soon developed a 20 car-length advantage. Behind those lead cars two fifth row starters, Jesse Giannetto and Billy Alley were storming through the 20 car field.



Lap eight saw Higday with a 30 car-length lead but Giannetto and Alley had worked their way to fourth and fifth place respectively. When Higday hit lap traffic on lap eleven it looked

respectively. When Higday hit lap traffic on lap eleven it looked as though he would have a cushion with those cars that were chasing him.

Then on lap thirteen the yellow flag was displayed for a car which had lost an engine but was unable to make it safely into the pits. The huge lead that Higday had built was suddenly gone.

On the single file restart Higday again took to the cushion as the cars behind him jostled for position. Alley passed both Hesmer and Giannetto for the runner-up spot and Giannetto passed Hesmer as well.

That is the way they finished as Higday took his self-owned Eagle/Ostrich to the winner's circle. It was Alley, Giannetto and Hesmer with Johnny Anderson taking fifth. Edwards, Tom Lenz, John VanDenBerg, Mike Houseman and Larry Ball, Jr. formed the top ten finishers.

To celebrate the annual Marion County Fair, two owners (410 and 360) were drawn from a hat and each was given a half beef and a half hog. The winners were Arends Racing and Josh Higday.

(Shaffer and Meyers Beat the Weather and Field to Take Pella Corp Prelim Wins)

August 1, 2003 - Tim Shaffer and Jason Meyers each captured preliminary feature event wins during Pella Corporation Classic preliminary racing action at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. A brief but heavy cloud burst hit the fairgrounds at 7:30 p.m. just as the green flag had waved the first qualifying heat into action. Track officials then set about to make the famous half mile into a race ready condition and the first heat field of cars then took to the track again at the 11 o'clock hour.



Shaffer, a World of Outlaws regular, did not have the first feature event locked up at all from the beginning of the 20-lap event. Johnny Herrera utilized his pole position start to grab the early lead. The first start was red flagged when Brian Brown spun in the first turn fence and collected Jesse Giannetto. Neither car restarted.

The complete restart saw Herrera again take the lead with Shaffer chasing him on the high cushion. Kenny Jacobs chased behind them but constantly tried a low line attempting to find a faster way around the big track. Wayne Johnson soon made a

pass of Jacobs taking the show position.

At the five lap mark Herrera had mustered a mere 10-car length lead over Shaffer. On the next go around a caution flag was displayed for a stopped car on the track bringing the field to a single file order. Herrera again took the top spot and seemed to have the race under his control until the half-way point when he suddenly slowed on the backstretch and stopped in turn three. It was later learned that he had lost a rear end in the Guy Forbrook machine.

With the race five miles from completion, Tim Shaffer took over the lead with Johnson in tow. Shane Stuart had moved into third and Jacobs in fourth. Five laps later showed Shaffer had moved the Roth Eagle/Wesmar back to a 10-lap cushion. And, that's the way it would finish as the Pennsylvania driver took the checkered flag and his first feature event win at this central Iowa racing facility. He was paid \$3,000 for his efforts. Johnson was second, Stewart maintained third, Jacobs took fourth and Kerry Madsen took passing honors after a twentieth position start and a fifth place finish. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Jeff Shepard, Dean Jacobs, Terry McCarl, Randy Hannagan and Colin Northway.



In the second Pella Corporation Classic preliminary feature, front row starter Jon Agan led the first two circuits of the ten-mile run only to have Jason Meyers get by him in turns one and two on the low side while Agan was running the cushion. The only caution of the event flew early on lap four for a stalled car as Meyers had developed a 20-car length lead.

On the restart Meyers, a California native, again shot to the front and by the half-way point had extended it to 30-car lengths as he entered lap traffic. Behind the Dollansky Maxim/Fisher a second Californian, Tim Kaeding was in a hot battle with Ricky Logan.

Chad Kemenah was running fourth with Agan in fifth.

This was a night for Meyers as the young driver, substituting for an injured Craig Dollansky, continued to extend his lead even though he was in lap traffic. At the three-quarters mark he had walked away to an enormous margin of the entire front chute over Kaeding. The Dollansky-owned machine seemed capable of taking any line on the track as well as through the backmarkers.

When Meyers took the \$3,000-to-win checkered flag he had in fact lapped up to ninth place in the 22-car field. Kaeding came across the line for a strong second place finish, Kemenah and Logan traded positions on the final circuit and Skip Jackson drove from 12th to take fifth. Don Droud, Jr. came from 13th to finish fifth. Jonathan Allard, Agan,, Jason Johnson and Dennis Moore, Jr. from the tail rounded out the top ten finishers. The final checkered flag flew at 2:20 a.m.

(delayed)- Terry McCarl got a little help from a friend and a late race caution flag to capture the 3rd annual Pella Corporation Classic. The friend was Wayne Johnson who drew the number two pill for McCarl after Terry had asked him to do the honors. That lucky draw insured McCarl a front row starting spot in the 25-lap championship feature. McCarl's good fortune is not to say that he did not drive a whale of a race too.

With Dean Jacobs and McCarl on the front row the race went green for the 24-car field without incident and with Jacobs showing the way down the back stretch. That quickly changed as second row starter Jason Meyers shot low in turns three and four and gained the top spot heading down the front chute. On the next go around McCarl too made a pass of Jacobs to take the runner-up spot as both he and Meyers set sail on the cushion, just feet from the big white fences.

Meyers, who is substituting for an injured Craig Dollansky, was able to build a twenty car-length advantage at the six lap mark over McCarl and third running Tim Shaffer who had passed Jacobs shortly after McCarl had done so. By the eighth circuit Meyers headed into lap traffic but the backmarkers did not hinder his pace as he was able to use all grooves of the big half-mile oval to make his passes.

Lap twelve saw Shaffer make a slide of McCarl in turns one and two but Terry gained the position back as they roared out of two and down the back chute. With Meyers maintaining a healthy lead, most eyes were focused on the battle for runner-up honors as they too went through lap traffic.

Just past the half-way point of the event, Meyers held a substantial lead over McCarl and Shaffer. Shane Stewart had now come into contention at fourth and Kerry Madsen was running fifth. Jacobs had faded to sixth, defending race champion Jeff Shepard held down the seventh spot, Jonathan Allard was running eighth, Don Droud, Jr. had ninth nailed down and Skip Jackson completed the top ten runners.

Lap sixteen showed Meyers exiting turn four as McCarl and Shaffer entered turn three. Two laps later Meyers could count his margin as a full straightaway. With the race winding down it looked to be a Meyers win.

On the twentieth circuit Shaffer again attempted the slide pass of McCarl in turns one and two. Again McCarl was able to grab the spot back again. Shane Stewart was running a close fourth and ready to jump on any mistake those two might make.

The only caution flag to fly on the race came out on the 21st lap as Kenny Jacobs parked his sprinter against the fence in turn three. He was the victim of a deflated right-rear tire but was able to rejoin the field once the change was made. It was the second piece of luck McCarl needed.

Meyers' huge advantage had suddenly disappeared in a race that seemly would go flag to flag. The single-file restart saw Meyers and McCarl take the cushion while Shaffer chose the low route. Shaffer's choice proved to be the right one as he took the lead coming out of turn two. That same lap saw McCarl slide Meyers in turn four to take the runner-up position. As Shaffer

and McCarl headed into turns one and two McCarl paid Shaffer back for the two slides earlier in the race and came out with the top spot for his effort.

With two laps to go, Knoxville's 4-time track champion cruised his Lori McCarl Eagle/Wesmar to a ten carlength victory worth \$15,000. Once he had parked his sprinter in the winners' circle he exited and commenced to perform the 'Jeff Swindell Wing Dance' in front of the large grandstand audience. One of the first things he said during his post-race interview is, "Hey Johnson, you're awesome!", referring to the fact that Wayne Johnson had drawn his number two starting position.

World of Outlaw runner Meyers finished second and Stewart made a strong run to take third. Meyers, another of the WoO faded to fourth and Shepard claimed fifth. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Don Droud, Jr., who started fourteenth, Madsen, Jackson, who started along side Droud, Ricky Logan and Brian Brown who began the race in twenty-second, a B Main transfer.

A total of 90 cars competed during the two-day Pella Corporation Classic.



(Stewart and Hull Are First-Time Winners at Knoxville Raceway) By Bob Wilson

Shane Stewart and Jerrod Hull captured their initial wins at Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. Stewart's win in the 410 division came during the Saturday Before the Nationals and Hull's win was in the 360's Brodix Tournament of Champions Invitational.



The 410 feature event saw Clint Garner jump from his pole position start to take the early lead in the 20-lap nightcap. Garner rode the cushion of Knoxville's big half mile to cruise to a tremendous lead in only four laps. The previous lap his sprinter began smoking as he apparently was experiencing some oil problems. Lap eight spelled disaster for Garner as he dove low in turn one and spun his sprinter as he entered turn two. The young driver tried to keep his car going but it died in the middle of the track. He was placed at the tail of the 24-car field. Also during this yellow flag event, Lynton Jeffrey pitted while running fifth only to exit the race once his car was checked by

his crew in the work area.

On the restart Wayne Johnson inherited the lead with Erin Crocker in tow. Ricky Logan passed Crocker on the next go around as did Stewart. Crocker continued to fade as the event raced to its conclusion.

With the race half gone, Johnson enjoyed a ten-car advantage over Stewart as Logan and Tim Kaeding followed in close quarters. Two laps later Terry McCarl entered the fray from his 21st starting position with Crocker and Tony Lutar just in front of him.

Lap fifteen saw Stewart pull within striking distance as he trailed Johnson by just five car lengths. Stewart guided his brand new Maxim/Wesmar to the low groove of the dry-slick track and took the lead on the 17th go around. The next circuit saw Johnson take the lead back again as he shot down the backstretch. Johnson went low in turns three and four in a blocking effort but Stewart was not to be denied as he took lap as they crossed the start-finish line.

The final lap saw both drivers jockey for position, but it was Stewart of Bixby, Oklahoma in his mIn Motorsports sprinter who took the \$3,000 checkered flags, one-car length ahead of Johnson in an exciting finish. Hull started on the pole of the 24-car field and jumped on the cushion to create a 20-car length lead by the five-lap mark. Loren Langerud trailed the fleet Show-Me-State pilot in second with Kevin Welsh running a close third.

A caution flag at the half-way point for a stalled car brought an end to Hull's enormous 30 car-length lead just as he headed into lap traffic.



On the restart Welsh and Billy Alley were the winners as they made headway when the green flew again. Welsh took the runner-up spot and Alley guided his sprinter into fifth. Alley made his headway on the bottom of the track as most of the front runners chose the top.

With seven miles in the books it was Hull, Welsh and Alley making his way to third. And that is the way this race would end as Hull, representing the Sprint Invaders Association raced to another 30 car-length advantage to take the \$2,000 win in his Harvill Eagle/Wells. Welsh was second for the United Racing Club and Alley claimed third for the Knoxville Regulars. Langerud was fourth as a WISSOTA regular and Jesse Giannetto took fifth for the Knoxville Regulars. Knoxville Raceway - August 10th, 2003 (McCarl Shows the Way in Brodix Tournament of Champions) By Bob Wilson

Terry McCarl, the current Knoxville Raceway 410 points leader, stepped into the John Kearney-owned 360 sprint car and took the 5th Brodix Tournament of Champions feature event Sunday night at Knoxville Raceway. McCarl, racing under the banner of the Sprint Invaders Association (SIA) collected \$4,000 for his efforts in the 30-lap race.

Billy Alley took the lead from his second row starting position when the race went green. Alley, the current 360 points leader at Knoxville, dove low in turns three and four taking the lead as he exited that final turn. Once in the lead he rested his car on the

cushion of the world-famous Knoxville half mile and set sail. By lap five he had registered a fifteen car-length lead but two laps later his advantage shrunk to zero as the yellow flag was displayed for a car part on the track surface. It was determined that the right front stop had come from the sprinter of Travis Rilat, who was running second at the time. Rilat was ordered to the work area where his car was repaired but he then had to restart at the tail of the 30-car field.

On the restart Jesse Giannetto dove low in turns one and two and grabbed the lead from Alley as they headed down the back chute. One lap later it was all over for Alley as he coasted around the half mile oval and came into the pit area, the victim of engine problems.

With Giannetto leading the pack, McCarl, a third row starter found himself in second with Chris Coyle running third and Shane Stewart, a tenth row starter, in fourth. At the half-way point that foursome remained the top runners with Zach Chappell in fifth and Ryan Jamison holding down the sixth position.

Lap traffic became a factor soon after the race hit half way. Giannetto and McCarl sorted through the backmarkers in close quarters with McCarl ready to strike should Giannetto falter. Lap 18 saw Giannetto become hindered by a lap car on the backstretch as McCarl very nearly took the lead. A pair of yellows on the twentieth and twenty-first laps slowed the field again and when the green flew again, McCarl had grabbed the lead coming out of turn two and down the back chute. Giannetto dove low in turns three and four which allowed a cushion running Stewart to forge to second on a hard and dry-slick track.

With McCarl now out front, Stewart became the man to chase down the Wesmar-powered machine. With just five laps to go he was within striking distance. McCarl's line was to run the cushion in turns one and two, dive low into three and then to drift up into turn four before shooting down the front stretch. Stewart stayed even and was only able to make any headway in this McCarl line when they finally hit lap traffic on the 29th circuit.

As McCarl took the checkered flag, Stewart flew past the flagstand too just one car length behind the four-time Knoxville track champion. Stewart, an American Sprint Car Series (ASCS) regular received \$3,000 for his run. Giannetto came across the line in third for KNOX, the Knoxville team. His payday was \$2,000. Fourth went to Ryan Jamison with fifth going to Jerrod Hull, both SIA regulars. They were paid \$1,500 and \$1,000 respectively. Rounding out the top ten finishers were Zach Chappell (ASCS), Dave Hesmer (KNOX), Roger Crockett (Northern Sprint Tour), Ed Ergenbright (KNOX) and Josh Higday (KNOX).

A total of 75 invitations were extended to eligible sprint car competitors from 13 360-cubic-sprint car sanctioning organizations. Those invited were: Winged Outlaw Warriors; Knoxville Raceway; WISSOTA Promoters Association; Sprint Invaders Association; American Sprint Car Series; Eagle Sprint Touring Series; Empire Super Sprints; Montana Sprint Tour; ASCS Sooner Region; United Racing Club; Sprints On Dirt; ASCS Rocky Mountain Region and Northern Sprint Tour. A total of 63 teams competed on the night.

Schatz started sixth in the event and took the lead on lap eight from early leader Joey Saldana, who started third in the 25-lap main event.

Saldana got the jump on front-row sitters Chad Kemenah and Greg Hodnett to lead the field in the beginning stages. On lap six, Schatz pulled even inside of Saldana, but could not make the pass stick. Schatz then tried the high groove and the two

raced side-by-side until Schatz pulled away in turn one on the lap seven. As he was about to hit lapped traffic on the 10th circuit around the hallowed half-mile, the caution flag was displayed for Kasey Kahne, who stopped on the frontstretch. When the race restarted, Schatz was able to pull away as Saldana was caught up in a torrid battle with Hodnett for the second spot. When Schatz brought the front-runners back to lapped traffic on the 16th lap, fifth-row starter Danny Lasoski began to pose a threat as he worked his way into second spot. The caution came out again on the 21st circuit when Jesse Hockett exploded a right-rear tire in turns one and two right in front of Lasoski. The Dude was able to dodge that bullet, but would have to put up with three lapped cars separating him from the leader on the restart.

Caution flags worked to Lasoski's advantage though. After he got around two of the lapped cars, Chad Kemenah spun on the fronstretch on the 22nd lap. That put only one car in between Lasoski and Schatz for a run to the finish. Lasoski did close in the final laps, but Schatz stole Lasoski's patented low groove around the speedway and held him off at the finish.

Following the race, Schatz said he saw Lasoski's number behind him on the leader board and knew he had work to do to keep the point. The win puts Schatz in good standing among the Wednesday competitors for Friday's A Scramble.

Schatz said later he was hoping to end his run of second-place finishes in Saturday's finale by finally taking home the big prize. "Second pays good but second sucks," he said. "It's probably one of the most disappointing things, even though you feel good." Following the race, Lasoski complimented the track preparations for the opening night of the Nationals. "I've been all over the country and I've never ever seen a race track prepared like this, where you could run all over the track all night," he said.

Sammy Swindell, the 1983 Nationals champion, shocked many during time trials. Drawing a fairly late number, Swindell laid down a lap of 15.286 to post quick time. Heat races were won by Hodnett, Shane Stewart, Kasey Kahne, Jason Sides and Lasoski. Toni Lutar won the C-Main and Kraig Kinser won the B-Main.

The night started out on an unfortunate note when Jeff Johnson spun in the first corner of the first heat race. Johnny Herrera had nowhere to go except into Johnson, and the contact sent both flipping into the fence.

Kinser tops Thursday qualifying feature By Stacy Ervin

EVELD at the convention of the

Defending Nationals champion Steve Kinser showed why he is the King by taking the lead on the white-flag lap of the 25-lap Thursday night qualifying feature for the 43rd annual Knoxville Nationals.

The race was plagued by caution periods, which eventually allowed Kinser to catch leader Wayne Johnson, a regular driver at Knoxville. Johnson started on the pole of the event and led all the way through the yellow-flag periods to the white-flag lap.

Even before the race started, another Knoxville regular, Chris

Walraven, had troubles and pulled to the work area. Because the pace truck had already pulled in to the infield, Walraven was unable to start the race.

When the race got underway, there was a lot of jockeying for position going on in the pack. With too many cars going for the same spot, Kerry Madsen spun in turn one to bring the first caution.

Madsen would be caught up in the second caution as well, when he and Jeff Mitrisin made contact on the third circuit. Mitrisin was unable to restart and made it known to Madsen that he was unhappy with the contact.

On the restart, third-starter Tim Shaffer tried to pull even with Johnson to grab the lead, but could not make that move work. The yellow came back again for a slowing Dennis Moore Jr. on lap five. When the race restarted again, Shaffer tried the same move, but it did not work once again.

On the seventh lap, Travis Cram brought out the caution when he slowed with a broken birdcage. By this time, Kinser had entered the mix and was dicing it up with Shaffer for the second spot.

The race saw red on the ninth lap, when Lynton Jeffrey tipped his machine over in turn two.

On the restart, Kinser dove low into turn one and tried a slide job on Johnson, but Johnson had a move of his own, and took the point again down the backstretch. The next lap around, it was the same situation and the two raced side-by-side for the next few circuits until Johnson was able to pull away.

Hitting lapped traffic on the 16th circuit allowed Kinser to close on Johnson, but the yellow came back out on the 22nd lap when Don Droud Jr. spun in turn three.

The next time around, another caution was brought out for Josh Higday, who hit the fence in turn three. At this point, Stevie Smith also slowed and ran out of fuel.

Kinser's big move came on the restart, when he put a slide job on Johnson and made it stick on the white-flag lap. On the last lap, Shaffer also got by Johnson, who came home third.

Madsen posted the fastest time trial of the night with a 15.290. Kurt Winker won the last-chance race. Heat races were won by Mike Reinke, Lynton Jeffrey, Randy Hannagan, Clint Garner and Johnson. Tyler Walker won the C-Main and Madsen won the B-Main.

Mark Hurd was the first driver to take a nasty tumble on the night. He bicycled the car in turn one during the last-chance race, hooked the cushion and rode out a nasty flip. Walker suffered a flat tire in his heat race and hit the fence. During the C-Main, Scott Young suffered a fire under the hood of his car.

The race was delayed for a while just as the first car was pushing off for time trials when the power went out. That affected some of the track lights on the frontstretch, the scoreboard, the track announcers' microphone, the scorers' computers and the stoplights. The first half of time trials was run without the power and the electronic scoring system.

Herrera scores non-qualifiers feature; Rilat wins Kele World Challenge By Stacy Ervin

Johnny Herrera scored the \$4,000 victory in Friday's non-qualifiers' 20-lap feature at the Knoxville Raceway. The night also featured scrambles for those drivers already qualified for Saturday's A, B and C features. Shane Stewart led every lap to win the A Scramble. Travis Rilat took the lead on the second lap of the Kele World Challenge Dash and went on to post the victory in the 16-lap event.

Herrera started the non-qualifiers' feature in 16th spot and worked his way toward the front. Polesitter Randy Hannagan jumped out to the lead from the pole position, but the yellow came out on lap two when Todd Hepfner tagged the wall in turn three and stopped on the fronstretch with a flat right-rear tire.

Hannagan hit lapped traffic on the seventh circuit, with Nationals rookie Roger Crockett chasing him. On the ninth lap, Crockett pulled out to the lead.

On the 12th lap, the red flag came out when Aaron Berryhill and Dean Jacobs got together in turn one and Berryhill flipped over. At that time, Justin Henderson also pulled to the work area with a power-steering problem. He was able to restart.

On the restart, no lapped cars were between Crockett and Hannagan. Also entering the mix was Herrera, who had worked his way up to third. When the race restarted, he passed Hannagan for the second spot.

The yellow returned on lap 15 when Jonathan Allard stopped with a flat left-rear tire at the entrance to the pits off turn four. Jon Agan also slowed with a flat right-front tire.

On the restart, Herrera tried to get the lead by putting a slide job on Crockett in turn four. The two touched wheels and then Crockett came back on Herrera. After some brief side-by-side racing, Herrera finally pulled away on lap 17 and led the rest of the way.

After crossing the stripe in second, Crockett was disqualified when his car failed to make the weight rule.

While Stewart led every lap of the A Scramble after starting on the pole, the real excitement of that 12-lap race came when Kerry Madsen and Steve Kinser made contact. That caused Kinser to lose a left-front wheel and hit the fence in turn three.

In the Kele World Challenge Dash, for international drivers who qualified at select races in California, Pennsylvania, Australia, New Zealand and Knoxville, the traditionally stellar display of fireworks went off overhead to start the race and end it. This year's pre-race ceremonies saw a special tribute to fallen Aussie Keith Hutton, who lost his life on Tuesday in a racing accident at the Southern Iowa Speedway. His wife, Jenny, director of scoring at Knoxville, waved the green flag on the event as she has for many years.

When the 16-lap race got underway, Aussie Marty Perovich took the lead into the first lap from his fourth starting position. The caution came out on that first lap though, when Canada's Adam West spun in turn two. That caused the crowd to gasp, as Nationals favorite Donny Schatz was nearly taken out in the mess to avoid West.

On the restart, Rilat took the lead with a move on the high side of the backstretch. He went on to lead the rest of the way to the checkered flag and fireworks. Americans Ricky Logan and Kurt Winker were second and third, respectively.

The B Scramble was won by Lance Dewease, while Tim Kaeding took the C Scramble.

Non-qualifiers' heat races were won by Hannagan, Max Dumesny, Henderson, Rilat and Brandon Wimmer. Jeff Johnson won the C-Main, while Jonathan Allard won the B-Main.

The night started out with a flip in hot laps, as Chris Walraven took a tumble in turn four. The nastiest incident of the night came at the start of the third heat. Bobby Mincer and Kim Mock got together and the contact sent Mock on a violent flip down the fronstretch. Pieces of his race car went flying down the track and when he landed, he was not moving. After many tense moments, particularly for his daughter and 2003 Nationals Queen, Patricia, who watched from the ambulance stand as the rescue crew took her father out of the car on a backboard. Before leaving the speedway for a trip to the Knoxville Area Community Hospital, Mock was winded, but talking to rescue workers.

Lasoski wins third Knoxville Nationals for boss Stewart By Stacy Ervin

Missouri's Danny Lasoski, the most dominant driver in the history of the Knoxville Raceway, captured the 30-lap national championship feature Saturday, August 16, at the 43^{rd Annual Ford Dealers of Iowa Knoxville Nationals.}

Though the win was Lasoski's third Nationals victory, it was a special one because his car owner, Tony Stewart, 2002 NASCAR Winston Cup champion, was in the house. With the Winston Cup tour racing at Michigan on Sunday, Stewart was able to fly in to Knoxville to witness his first Saturday night at the Nationals as a car owner.

Stewart saw Lasoski come from the second row of the starting grid to challenge early leader and Nationals favorite Donny Schatz, who started on the pole. Schatz led the first seven laps of the feature before Lasoski got by outside polesitter Greg Hodnett and set his sights on the leader.

On the seventh circuit around the hallowed half-mile, Lasoski pulled inside Schatz down the backstretch and took the lead, with heavy lapped traffic in front of the pair. The traffic allowed Schatz to stay close for much of the race, and a wheelstand down the backstretch on lap 19 allowed him to get a run on Lasoski.

Hodnett slowed on the 22nd lap with a smoking race car, but the race's only caution period came on the 28th lap, when Daryn Pittman stopped on the frontstretch.

On the restart that followed, there were no lapped cars placed between Lasoski and Schatz, setting up a three-lap dash to the finish. It was at this point that it was noted that Lasoski's left-rear tire had a bad bounce. But that would not be enough to stop him from taking the win over Schatz and a charging Kenny Jacobs, who got third.

After making sure his car made the weight rule—a first for the Knoxville Nationals—Lasoski was jubilant as he entered victory lane with Stewart. Lasoski threw his gloves in the air in celebration, then climbed on top of the car's wing to the delight of the photographers.

Following the race, Lasoski said a shock absorber had broken on the car. In the press conference that followed, Stewart said the worst part of the week for him was having to leave the celebration early to return to Michigan for Sunday's race.

"This is the only Knoxville Saturday night I've been able to make and it's a lot bigger to me than whatever happens tomorrow, even if I win," he said.

A visibly disappointed Schatz, who has now put together a long string of heartbreakingly close performances at the Nationals, said although he finished second, he felt he had a "fifth-place car."

"Come feature time, I was trying to play mechanic," he said, adding he made a decision to change a left-rear tire and some gears in the car. The changes did not work well and Schatz had trouble taking off on the late restart, which kept him from getting close enough to pass Lasoski.

Though there was only one caution period in the A-Main, the rest of the night was marked by numerous cautions and many violent accidents.

At the start of the B-Main, Knoxville regulars Josh Higday and Skip Jackson got together. The contact sent Higday on an extremely high series of cartwheels down the fronstretch. Jackson also flipped several times along the billboards lining victory lane. Jac Haudenschild was tagged in the melee and suffered a broken nose wing and top wing and a bent front axle.

On the restart, Tim Kaeding and Lynton Jeffrey got together, which broke the front axle on Kaeding's machine. Also in the work area at that time was Don Droud Jr., who fixed a broken Jacob's ladder. Jeffrey changed a left -rear tire and was back in business.

But more chaos ensued on the restart, when Eric Vanderploeg spun several times and tipped over in turn one. That sent his load of fuel pouring out of the car and onto the track.

When the race finally got going, Kraig Kinser jumped out to the lead from the outside pole position. But the yellow flag came out on lap eight when Kevin Frey slowed in turns three and four.

On the 19th lap, the red flag returned when Jesse Hockett blew a tire and flipped in turn three. On the restart, Chad Kemenah stole the lead from Kinser, but the pass was negated when Travis Cram, who had been running in a transfer position, slowed on the track out of fuel. Cram was attempting to pull to the pit area off turn four and avoid bringing out a caution, but Jeffrey was to his inside. The two made contact and that sent Jeffrey flipping on the frontstretch wall.

On the restart, Jason Sides blew a right-rear tire and suffered suspension damage. Kemenah got the lead back on the white-flag lap and he and Kinser raced side -by-side for much of the final circuit. Kemenah got the win with Kinser second.

Tim Kaeding led all but two laps in the C-Main to capture that victory. While he was leading, the yellow flag came out on the fourth lap for Dennis Moore Jr., who stopped in turn four with a broken fuel pump.

On the restart, Mike Kertscher caught the fence in turns one and two, and flipped over. The yellow returned a few laps later when Jesse Giannetto tagged the wall in turn two and pulled to the pit area.

On the 11th lap, Brian Paulus took the high groove around lapped traffic and took the point away from Kaeding. With traffic heavy, the two went three-wide at one point with the lapped car of Max Dumesny. Kaeding got the lead back in turn four on the white-flag lap and he and Paulus raced side-by-side for the lead on the final lap. Kaeding persevered, with Paulus second.

Jerrod Hull led all 12 laps of the D-Main. That race also saw several cautions. The first red flag came on the original start, when Ty Bartz got out of shape, got tagged by another car and was sent for a series of snap rolls along the turn-two fence.

On the restart, Colin Northway tagged the wall and stopped with a broken Jacob's ladder. The red returned on lap two, when Mike Moore flipped in turn four. Brian Brown also stopped with tire damage in turn four. Another red was displayed on the restart, when Jeff Johnson got into the guardrail in turn one and flipped. The yellow returned on lap eight when Justin Henderson and Chuck Swenson both rolled to a stop on the speedway.

At the end, Hull was challenged by Jonathan Allard, who raced him side-by-side on the last lap. The two even made contact down the backstretch, but Hull held on for the win.

The E-Main got the night off on a bad note. On the seventh lap, Mark Toews flipped in turn three and got so high that he went right over the wall between the scoreboard and the billboards in that area. Toews is the third driver to flip over the fence in that area. Troy Little led every lap of that feature to record the win.

The feature event began with a three-car skirmish on the backstretch at the pit entrance eliminating that trio of cars right off the bat. Once the race went green again Northway, who started on the front row, grabbed the top spot and began to roar away from the 20-car field. At first he was chased by Jaymie Moyle, Travis Cram and Don Droud, Jr. None of the three were able to keep pace with the Maxim Wesmar as Northway pulled away to a lead that showed a gap of the entire front straight away.

When Eddie Leavitt, Jr. spun his sprinter at the flagstand on the seventh circuit, it wiped out that tremendous advantage which Northway had built as the cars positioned themselves for a single file restart. When the race went green again Northway again pulled away from the pack but McCarl had driven from his sixth row starting spot to register a fourth place showing. At the five-mile point of the Season Championship race, it was Northway, Moyle, McCarl, Cram and Skip Jackson. Three laps later the last yellow of the race was displayed for Droud who had stopped at the third turn fence.

The restart showed the drivers maintaining their position for a single circuit but on the next go around McCarl picked up one additional spot to place himself in the runner-up spot while 410 rookie Brian Brown, who started in the row behind McCarl had driven to the fifth spot.

With the race past the half-way point, the only question to be asked was whether McCarl could catch Northway. With the frontrunner on the cushion of the track, McCarl began to experiment with different lines on the big half-mile oval. None of his new lines seemed to pull him any closer to the fleet North 60 Racing machine.

Lap 20 found Northway with a fairly comfortable 10 car-length lead. Two laps later he headed into lap traffic and his advantage immediately fell to half that. As the frontrunning duo fought through the backmarkers, it looked as if McCarl could pull the win right out of his helmet. However, on the final lap with those two running nearly nose to tail, McCarl became entrapped by a slower car in turn two and no amount of heroics would enable him to catch and pass Northway on this night.

Northway took the \$4,000 checkereds some ten car-lengths ahead of McCarl (\$3,000) and Moyle (\$2,000) came across the line for third. Fourth went to Cram, while Brown, after fighting a long battle with Jackson took fifth. Brooke Tatnell, subbing for the injured Derek Beckman was seventh as John VanDenBerg took passing honors from dead last to finish eighth. Kerry Madsen, another l0th row starter, and Ricky Logan rounded out the top ten finishers.

In the season finale for the 360 sprint division, Joe Beaver utilized his pole position start to grab the early lead in that 20-lap event. Beaver took to the cushion immediately to pull away from his nearest competitor, Tim St. Arnold. By the sixth go around he had developed a 15 car-length advantage.

The race had been billed as a showdown between Billy Alley and Jesse Giannetto. Just 10 points in the season-long points battle had separated the two drivers going into the evening's racing events. With Alley starting tenth and Giannetto twelfth, the feature looked to be an exciting finale. However, right at the start, Alley was able to move up from his position while Giannetto became ensuared with cars ahead of him and never really became a factor as the race progressed.

At the half-way mark of the race, Beaver lead St. Arnold with Alley holding down third and Randy Martin showing a close fourth. The next lap saw the sprinters entering into lap traffic as Alley took over the second spot and began his chase-down of Beaver. The 19-year-old rookie caught him on the 14th circuit and made the pass in heavy traffic. For all practical purposes, that was the end of the race.

One yellow flag slowed the event just after the fifteenth go around but that did not stop the 2002 Eagle Raceway (Nebr.) champion from guiding his Alley Eagle/Wesmar to his fifth feature event win of the season here. Alley, who is in only his second full season in sprints collected \$1,500 for his efforts. Martin, who made a final lap pass of Beaver took home \$1,250. Beaver's third paid him \$1,000. Rounding out the top ten finishers were David Hesmer, Giannetto, Doug Wilson, Steve Breazealle, Mike Houseman, St. Arnold and Brett Golik.
