**Sheldon Haudenschild Steals One on Last Lap From Scelzi for \$5,000 at Knoxville!
Jamie Ball Cruises to 360 Win; Tyler Groenendyk Chalks Up First Ever Win in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (April 17, 2021) – A large crowd saw Sheldon Haudenschild join his father Jac as a Knoxville Raceway winner by taking the Pella Motors/Kraig Ford Season Opener at the Knoxville Raceway

Saturday night. Sheldon's 410 win aboard the Stenhouse/Marshall Racing #17 came with a last lap pass after starting fourteenth, and was worth \$5,000 to the Wooster, Ohio native. Jamie Ball led wire to wire to record his seventh career 360 feature win at Knoxville, while Tyler Groenendyk capped a two-year absence from Knoxville Raceway by recording his first career win in the Pace Performance Pro Sprints. Eighty-two cars signed in for opening night.

Austin McCarl lost a row one starting spot in the 20-lap 410 feature before the green flag fell, after a loose fitting detected a fuel leak. He would come back to provide plenty of heroics. On the start, Brian Brown got over the infield berm in turn one and tipped over. Several crews aided his replacement of tires and a top wing to rejoin the field at the tail.

Once the event got underway, Gio Scelzi took command. Aaron Reutzel was an early mover as well, coming from the fourth row to second by the second lap. Meanwhile, Scelzi took off, entering lapped traffic by the fifth circuit and putting 4.6 seconds between himself and Reutzel.

In the middle stages, Carson Macedo and Reutzel battled for second, trading that spot twice. On lap 12, disaster struck for both. Macedo suffered a flat right rear, while Reutzel tangled with Josh Schneiderman just after the ensuing caution was thrown. All three cars were done.

The restart with eight to go, saw Scelzi leading Sam Hafertepe Jr., Haudenschild (from 14th), Spencer Bayston and Terry McCarl back to green. Meanwhile, Austin McCarl had worked his way from the tail back into the top ten. In two laps, he shot from night to fourth, while Haudenschild jumped into second in pursuit of the leader. McCarl passed Hafertepe for the third spot with five to go.

While Scelzi searched low on the dry track for rubber that never came, Haudenschild rode the cushion, tracking him down. In turn two on the final circuit, Haudenschild shot to the point and recorded his first ever win at the historic oval. Scelzi came home second, ahead of Austin McCarl, Hafertepe and Davey Heskin. Brooke Tatnell, Bayston, Terry McCarl, Lynton Jeffrey and Sawyer Phillips rounded out the top ten. Macedo set quick time, while Brown, Phillips, Bayston and Haudenschild won the heats. Matt Juhl claimed the B main.

"We were a little free at the beginning," said Haudenschild in Victory Lane. "We just kind of had to manage that race a little bit and let it play out. I knew it was a short race, and I was just trying to be there at the end. That caution saved us. I can't give it up to my guys enough. We trucked it up from down south to do this, and that was our goal...to win a race at Knoxville. We're just thankful to be up here."

Jamie Ball took off from outside row one in the 18-lap 360 feature, ahead of Lee Grosz and Ryan Giles. Kaleb Johnson worked by Giles into third early on, and Clint Garner worked his way into the top five. A lap four spin by Ricky Montgomery set up a restart that saw Ball leading Grosz, Johnson, Garner and Giles.

Garner quickly moved into third, and at the halfway point, passed Grosz for second. By lap ten, the leaders were in heavy lapped traffic and it looked like Garner had a shot at the leader. However, a slowing Collin Moyle brought a caution and opened up the track for Ball. The restart saw Joe Beaver slow down the frontstretch. He was tagged hard by Mike Johnston, who walked away but underwent observation.

Ball took off from there, while Garner and Grosz dueled for second. The win was worth \$2,000 to the Knoxville native. Garner held on for second, ahead of Grosz, Jason Martin and Johnson. Chase Randall, Riley Goodno, Calvin Landis, Josh Higday and hard-charger Nate Mills completed the top ten. Grosz set quick time over the field, while Randall, Christopher Thram and Gunner Ramey all won heats in their first ever weekly action.

"Things in life change, but God answers a lot of prayers," said Ball in Victory Lane beside his Jamie Ball Racing #4w. "Things have worked out for the better. Everyone who works on this car...it's been such a grind. We weren't even ready until yesterday. I used to worry a lot about what I'd do wrong. I've been trying to

change my mindset this year about what can go right, instead of what can go wrong. I knew my guys gave me the car to beat. I can't wait to do this the rest of the year hopefully.”

The 15-lap feature for the Pro Sprints was an entertaining as the rest. Chase Young led from the pole early, but many eyes were on Devin Wignall, who started 14th, and used the high side to drive up to fourth by the completion of the first lap. On lap three, he shot from fourth to second in his attempt to track down Young.

Meanwhile, Tyler Groenendyk, new to the class after a two year absence from Knoxville, had moved into third by lap six. The leaders entered lapped traffic on the seventh circuit and Wignall found his opportunity to take the lead. Scotty Johnson would spin with eight laps completed, bringing the first caution of the race.

Wignall led Young and Groenendyk back to green. While Wignall went low, Young went high and shot back up front. Groenendyk followed him into second on the low side, while Evan Epperson entered the top three on the cushion. A slowing Jaslyn Jones brought yellow with three to go.

On the white flag lap, Groenendyk's pursuit paid off, but before the checkers could fly, Johnson tipped over in turn two. He was uninjured. The green, white, checker finish added a lap, but Groenendyk was able to stay out front for an emotional win. Epperson used a last corner pass to take second, while Young crossed third, but was light at the scales. Brandon Worthington moved up to the show position, ahead of Devin Kline and Matthew Stelzer. Wignall, Mike Mayberry, Cam Martin, Jeff Wilke and Tyler Barrick rounded out the top ten. Epperson and Young won the heats. A scary incident in the first heat saw contact from another car send Kade Higday into a series of flips. Matt Allen was also involved, but neither driver was injured, and both returned for the feature.

“I've been trying to this my whole life,” said an emotional Groenendyk. “There's so many important and amazing people who've let me do this over the years and be in a position to do this. In this race, they didn't make it easy, but we got it done this time. I haven't been in the seat of a racecar for two years, but I have incredible marketing partners on this car, including Kraig Chevrolet.”

Austin McCarl Tops Knoxville with Emotional Win!

Josh Higday Wins for First Time Since 2010 in 360's; Matthew Stelzer Back Atop All-Time Win List in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (April 24, 2021) – Austin McCarl registered his fifth career 410 win at Knoxville Saturday night, but it was his first as a car owner. That made it emotional for the Altoona driver, who cashed in \$4,000 aboard his #17A. Des Moines, Iowa's Josh Higday was no less excited, as he registered his first win since May 15, 2010 in the 360 class. It was the 18th of his career, tying him with Dean Chadd for fifth on the all-time win

list. Matthew Stelzer won in the Pace Performance Pro Sprints class, putting him in a tie with Devin Kline for most all-time in that class (13).

When an invert of zero was drawn for the 20-lap 410 feature, most concluded that defending track champion, Brian Brown, would be tough to beat. They were right. He set quick time and won his heat going away. At the start of the main event, he took off, opening a lead over Austin McCarl, Lynton Jeffrey, Ian Madsen and Justin Henderson.

Hunter Schuerenberg entered the top five on lap three, but up front, Brown was roaring through lapped traffic by lap five. On lap six, disaster struck for Brown when his power plant gave way.

McCarl, who charged from the rear of the field to third in last week's opener, was equally fast and up to the task after inheriting the lead. Behind him, Madsen took second from Jeffrey, and Brooke Tatnell surged from sixth to fourth.

McCarl opened up a big lead, while Madsen nailed down second, followed by Jeffrey. Schuerenberg worked his way up to fourth with eight to go, and Tatnell finished fifth. Terry McCarl was the hard-charger, driving from 16th to sixth. Davey Heskin, Henderson, Cole Duncan and Sawyer Phillips rounded out the top ten. Jeffrey and Moeller joined Brown as heat winners.

"This is a brand new car," said McCarl in Victory Lane. "I scaled it yesterday. I was actually a little happier with the numbers than the other car. I was confident coming in if thing was close, and it was. I've wanted to do this in my own car so bad...nothing against what I've done before in winning races...but I did it by myself with great people behind me. I'm so happy! I'm here to win races, and not for points. I knew Ian was coming. That team's really been clicking."

Scott Bogucki led the 18-lap 360 feature early ahead of Josh Higday, Lee Grosz, Ryan Giles and Ricky Montgomery. Young Chase Randall entered the top five early before Dylan Westbrook tangled with the turn three wall to bring caution three laps in.

Bogucki led Higday, Grosz, Giles and Randall back to green flag racing. Higday gained momentum on the cushion and shot into the lead on lap six. Grosz followed him into second two laps later. A battle was waging for fourth between Giles and Randall, with the latter securing the spot with eight to go.

Bogucki regained his momentum, and by lap 11 was by Grosz for second. He appeared to be gaining on Higday when something broke on the car and he pulled off on lap 12.

It was clear sailing for Higday in the Hetrick Motorsports #35 as they celebrated an emotional win ahead of Grosz, Randall, Jamie Ball and Giles. Carson McCarl, Clint Garner, JJ Hickle, Matt Moro and Montgomery completed the top ten. Bogucki set quick time over the 37-car field, while Hickle, Rob Kubli, Westbrook and Ball won heat races. Matt Covington claimed the B main.

"I tell you what, it seems like an eternity," said Higday of his eleven-year drought in Victory Lane. "This was awesome. For a 45-year old man to come out here and do this...I feel great. I was a little tight there at the beginning. I knew we'd probably be good once the fuel burned off. It was a hell of a race. Scott's a hell of a racer. We're really happy to get the win tonight."

The 15-lap Pace Performance Pro Sprints feature got off to a tough start. Ryan Navratil got into the turn one wall bringing caution. Meanwhile, Kade Higday flipped hard in turn three. He exited the car under his own power.

Matthew Stelzer led early over Tyler Groenendyk, Brandon Worthington, Mike Mayberry and Devin Kline. Another yellow flew one lap in for Devin Wignall, who came to a rest in turn four. Evan Epperson found something on the cushion to charge up to third behind Stelzer and Groenendyk before JJ Beaver spun three laps in.

It was Kline's turn to move up, as he took over fourth when the green flew, and overtook Epperson for third on lap seven. Up front, Stelzer was cruising with Groenendyk trying to stay close enough for a late shot. His opportunity came with another Beaver spin with two to go.

Stelzer would not be headed, however, crossing the finish line ahead of Groenendyk, Epperson (by .023 of a second over Kline) and Worthington. Chase Young, Jeff Wilke, Matt Allen, Alex Vande Voort and Tyler Barrick rounded out the top ten. Higday and Kline were heat race winners.

"Those cautions and red flags kept coming out," said Stelzer in Victory Lane. "Last week, we ran out of fuel on the last lap and I was just nervous about if we had enough fuel in the car. Tyler G...I love having him in this class, because he's going to make me better as a driver. I was a little nervous with him starting outside of us. I threw a couple of these away last year with Russ (Hall) and Devin next me, but tonight we were able to capitalize."

**Lynton Jeffrey Tops Them All at Knoxville!
Clint Garner Grabs Career Win #41 in 360's; Matthew Stelzer Wins Again in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (May 1, 2021) – Lynton Jeffrey scored a popular win on Jersey Freeze/Dennison Racing Tees Night Saturday at the Knoxville Raceway. The Australian now making his home in Prairie City, Iowa took home \$4,000 for his win aboard the Ridge and Sons Racing #83. Clint Garner led wire to wire to record career 360 win #41, and Matthew Stelzer won for the second week in a row in the Pro Sprints presented by Pace Performance. He now sits atop the all-time win list in that class with fourteen.

Sawyer Phillips led the 20-lap 410 feature early on ahead of Jeffrey, Davey Heskin, Don Droud Jr. and Terry McCarl. AJ Moeller slowed with suspension problems two laps in while running sixth. Jeffrey slid under Phillips in turn four on the restart, taking the lead. On lap four, Justin Henderson moved by Terry McCarl to enter the top five.

Austin Miller slowed with a flat left rear tire eight laps in, bringing out another yellow. Jeffrey led the field back to green, ahead of Phillips, Heskin, Droud and Henderson. Henderson shot from fifth to third before Carson McCarl tagged the turn one fence. After changing a tire in the work area, he rejoined the field.

Henderson capped another good restart by taking second from Phillips, while McCarl moved up into the top four. Jeffrey opened up a 2.3 second lead through traffic, only to have it erased when seventh running Tasker Phillips stopped in turn four. Eighth running Don Droud Jr. also stopped with mechanical ills.

Jeffrey was able to stretch out for his fifth career 410 win, and first since the World Challenge in 2015. Henderson nailed down second, followed by Sawyer Phillips, Heskin and McCarl. Matt Juhl, hard-charger Riley Goodno, Chris Martin, Josh Schneiderman and Cody Ledger rounded out the top ten. Heskin set quick time over the field, while Jeffrey, Carson McCarl and Goodno won heat races.

It was a difficult night for the McCarl brothers. After April 24 winner Austin had to change motors after hot laps, Carson lost one in his own car before getting a time trial lap in. The motor that was being put in Austin's car remained, but Carson took over the wheel of the #17A. The number was changed to #27, and since neither car had timed in, Carson was scored in that entry for the night.

“You're always nervous for a yellow when you're leading,” said Jeffrey of the late caution. “The track started taking a little rubber and got slicked off there on the bottom. I didn't know that. I was up on the curb. I was getting a little reckless up there, and nervous. The laps were ticking down...I'm sure they were coming on me. I'm just really happy for these guys and all the effort they put in.”

Clint Garner shot out immediately in the 18-lap 360 feature and was never challenged in the non-stop event. Kelby Watt settled into second early on, ahead of Nate Mills, Ryan Giles and Christopher Thram. Garner was already in lapped traffic on the fifth lap, while Calvin Landis and Josh Higday battled for the fifth spot. Great racing from third through fifth ensued.

Garner had built almost a three second advantage by the halfway point, when Giles took second from Watt. Joe Beaver entered the battle for fifth in the late stages as well. In his best career finish, Mills aced third from Watt with three laps to go.

Garner's final advantage over Giles eclipsed four seconds. Mills's career best third place finish came ahead of Watt and Higday. Beaver, hard-charger Jamie Ball, Rob Kubli, Landis and Gunner Ramey completed the top

ten. Watt shook his bad luck of the first two weeks by setting quick time, and Kaleb Johnson, Matt Moro and Garner were heat race winners.

“The guys that weren’t having any fun were definitely off the pace,” said Garner of his path through lapped traffic. “The car was great. Qualifying was off a little bit again tonight. Hopefully, we can get back up in the top five qualifying, because I want to win the points bad, and in order to do that, I need to qualify well. (These young guns) have the talent...it’s just going to take some time to get the experience. The track was perfect tonight for a guy like myself whose been here a hundred times. Hat’s off to the Dunkins. This was my kind of track.”

Matt Stelzer shot out from the pole in the 15-lap Pro Sprints feature ahead of Brandon Worthington and Chase Young. Ryan Navratil and Tyler Barrick came together to bring the yellow flag four laps in. Devin Kline took over third on the restart.

Worthington was good on the cushion and reeled in the leader, taking the point on lap seven. A great battle for fourth emerged at that time, with Tyler Groenendyk taking that spot from Young with five to go.

A final caution for a stopped JJ Beaver set up a Dash for the checkers. Stelzer capitalized on a Worthington mistake to take the lead back and claim his second win in a row. Worthington was second, ahead of Groenendyk, who passed Kline with three to go. Young, Devin Wignall, Jeff Wilke, Evan Epperson, Matt Allen and Alex Vande Voort rounded out the top ten. Barrick and Joel Thorpe won heat races.

“Brandon did a good job as a driver, and he deserved to be up here,” said Stelzer in Victory Lane. “That was his race. He just made one little mistake there that cost him. That’s where my experience comes into play there. I didn’t know if the bottom was working. When you start up in the front row like that, you just don’t know where the track is. Brandon showed it to me, and I knew if I could just get by Brandon on that restart, I could take his line on the bottom.”

Brian Brown Sweeps Dual Features, Sets New One-Lap Record at Knoxville! Ryan Giles Wins 360 Thriller; Tyler Groenendyk Tops Pro Sprints by Bill Wright

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (May 22, 2021) – Vermeer Night at Knoxville Raceway belonged to Brian Brown Saturday night! The Grain Valley, Missouri native started the evening by besting a fifteen-year-old one-lap track record, and ended it winning not only the scheduled main event, but also the make-up feature from a week ago. Ryan Giles made a late restart pass to claim his tenth career main event win in the 360 class, while Tyler Groenendyk won his second Pro Sprints presented by Pace Performance feature of the year.

Week and day long showers did not deter the track crew or fans from getting the races in on Saturday. A delay of over one hour did not slow anyone down either. What it did do was make for a lightning-fast half-mile.

It was a unique night in 2006 when Brooke Tatnell set the one-lap track record at 14.407 seconds. Though many have flirted with the mark, none eclipsed it until Saturday, when Brown posted the new mark at 14.351 seconds, an average speed of around 125 miles per hour.

Lining up third in the first 20-lap feature of the night, Brown shot by the front row to lead almost immediately ahead of Sawyer Phillips and AJ Moeller. Justin Henderson soon entered the top three.

Brown entered lapped traffic on the seventh lap, and had built a 2.8 second lead by the halfway point. Henderson worked on Phillips and passed him on the high side with four laps to go to take the second spot.

Brown's 5.5 second lead was eliminated after he took the white flag when Austin Miller came to a stop in turn two. Brown led Henderson, Phillips, Moeller and Matt Juhl back to green. Phillips used the low side to fly by Henderson for second, but that was negated when his brother Tasker went up in smoke in turn two.

The restart saw Brown take off, Sawyer take second for good, and Carson McCarl charge from seventh to round out the podium in the last two laps. Henderson, Juhl, Moeller, Parker Price-Miller, Lynton Jeffrey, Terry McCarl and Ayrton Gennetten rounded out the top ten. Chris Martin, Juhl and Terry McCarl won the heats.

"I was just trying to keep up the pace," said Brown in Victory Lane. "Those Outlaw guys run hard. If you're going to beat them here in a couple of weeks (June 11 and 12), you've got to run hard in traffic. It's something I need to keep working at as a driver. We'll keep working on that."

In the make-up feature, Gennetten got the jump from outside of the front row and set a good pace ahead of Carson McCarl, Price-Miller, Brown and Moeller. Price-Miller drove the Forbrook #5x into second on lap two, while Davey Heskin entered the top five.

Brown passed McCarl for third on lap three, while up front, Gennetten was maneuvering lapped traffic by the fifth circuit. At that point, Austin Miller stopped to bring a caution. Gennetten led Price-Miller, Brown, McCarl and Heskin back to green. Heskin used the low side to gain fourth, while Brown and Price-Miller battled hard for the runner-up spot. Brown took that on lap nine.

Gennetten was smooth on the cushion, however and he was back in lapped traffic with four to go. Brown stalked him slowly and then performed a slide job to lead lap nineteen. Gennetten's impressive run ended in second, ahead of Price-Miller, Heskin and McCarl. Sawyer Phillips, Henderson, Jeffrey, Juhl and hard-charger Terry McCarl completed the top ten. Brown's wins were number 52 and 53 here.

"Hats off to Ayrton," said Brown. "He did a really good job there and I didn't think I was going to get him. I found the bottom in one and two, and I figured I'd have one chance if I didn't mess it up. I felt like when he got to that lapped car he hesitated just for a second and I got a good run. I was able to cross there. Hat's off to the Dunkin's and the track crew for getting it in. Overall, this was just an awesome night."

Rob Kubli led early in the 18-lap 360 feature ahead of Scott Bogucki and Nate Mills. Mechanical issues plagued Kaleb Johnson, who stopped and then exited one lap in. Stu Snyder slowed and exited on that restart.

Kubli kept a good pace up front, but Bogucki tracked him down when Kubli moved to the low side of turns one and two on lap seven. Shortly after that, Chase Porter came to a stop inside turn four. With 11 laps to go, Bogucki led Kubli, Giles, Mills and Jamie Ball.

Giles quickly shot by Kubli for second, while Mills followed him into third on lap nine. Bogucki was negotiating lapped traffic by lap 13, but two laps later, fifth running Ricky Montgomery spun.

Giles pounced on the restart, sliding in front of Bogucki and holding on to win his tenth career feature here. Bogucki held on for second ahead of Ball, who gained third on the last lap, Mills and Matt Moro. Clint Garner, hard-charger Josh Higday, Kubli, Calvin Landis and Kelby Watt rounded out the top ten. Giles also set quick time about one-tenth off the track record, while Tony Rost, Porter and Collin Moyle won heats.

"We had one rough night this year to get going," said Giles in Victory Lane. "I can't thank this team enough for getting us going. Right now, we're having a lot of fun. That bottom...I was able to hold it down and float it...it

was kind of brown coming off. I was just trying to hold it there and make sure (Bogucki) couldn't get back underneath me. Luckily, we were able to hang on and here we are.”

The Pro Sprints presented by Pace Performance saw a familiar leader early in the 15-lap main event. Matthew Stelzer, who had won two in a row was out front, ahead of Alex Vande Voort and Mike Mayberry, who had already charged from outside row four.

Tyler Groenendyk slid Mayberry on lap two. Mayberry shot over the cushion and lost several spots. Devin Wignall worked from fifth to third by lap five, when Ryan Navrital spun and backed into the turn one wall. He was uninjured.

Stelzer led Groenendyk, Wignall, Vande Voort and Mayberry back to green. Mayberry hit the cushion to take fourth in his battle back. On lap seven, Groenendyk, stuck the low side of one and two to pass Stelzer for the point. Wignall and Mayberry battled with Stelzer for the second spot most of the way, while Groenendyk pulled away for his second win this season and in his career.

Wignall passed Stelzer for second with three to go, and Mayberry got him late for third. Chase Young was fifth. Devin Kline, Evan Epperson, Eric Bridger, Brandon Worthington and Vande Voort completed the top ten. Bridger and Scotty Johnson were the heat winners.

“I just had to go where they weren't,” said Groenendyk of his pass of Stelzer. “There was tons of grip in the racetrack tonight. We've been off the last couple weeks, but I have a lot of smart people behind the scenes helping me. They got me going when I needed it.”

Brad Sweet Invades Knoxville for \$5,000 Payday!

Jamie Ball Roars to Another 360 Win; Devin Wignall Leads Wire to Wire in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (May 29, 2021) – A night off from the World of Outlaws paid off for Grass Valley California’s Brad Sweet, as he garnered his seventh career feature win at the Knoxville Raceway Saturday on Knoxville Hospital & Clinics/Slideways Night. The win, aboard the Kasey Kahne Racing #49s was worth \$5,000. Jamie Ball made a mid-race pass of last week’s feature winner, Ryan Giles, to claim his eighth career win here in the 360 class. Devin Wignall led all 15 laps to take the Pro Sprints presented by Pace Performance feature.

Gio Scelzi was a rocket from his pole position in the 25-lap 410 main event early on. Spencer Bayston, Brad Sweet, Brian Brown and Carson Macedo were in tow. Macedo quickly moved into fourth, while Bayston pressured the leader. On lap four, there was a dead heat for the lead between Scelzi and Bayston, before the former pulled back in front.

On lap six, Sweet was able to get by Bayston for second, and set his sights on the leader. Beginning lap seven, he shot by Scelzi for the lead, but Gio spun in turn two, and had to restart at the tail. Aaron Reutzel also surrendered his top ten run, and headed to the work area. He would restart at the tail and work his way back up to sixth at the checkers.

With 19 laps to go, Sweet led Bayston, Brown, Macedo and James McFadden back to green. Brown, who won two features here a week ago, moved into second, while Macedo found his way by Bayston in great racing for the third spot. At that point, seventh running Justin Henderson and Rico Abreu made contact. The result was a flat left rear tire for Henderson, and another restart at the tail.

Sweet took off on the restart and was back in lapped traffic with ten to go. With five to go, Tasker Phillips had a left front tire go flat as he spun in turn four. It would prove to be the last caution.

Sweet pulled away for the win. Macedo moved into second on the final restart, while McFadden took third from Brown with three to go. Abreu ended fifth. Reutzel came from the tail to sixth, and Bayston, Austin McCarl, Davey Heskin and Parker Price-Miller rounded out the top ten. Terry McCarl was the hard-charger with a 360 under the hood, coming from an alternate position to finish fourteenth. He was an alternate for Lynton Jeffrey, who flipped after his car suffered a malfunction in his heat race. He was uninjured. Bayston set quick time, while Henderson, Matt Juhl and Reutzel were heat race winners. Josh Schneiderman claimed the B main.

“This was some stiff competition,” said Sweet in Victory Lane. “We were just focused on getting this car feeling better at Knoxville. I think we actually hit on something that was pretty good there. We were way better than we’ve been. I’m happy leaving here. It was definitely worth the trip over. The racetrack was great...great crowd, great weather. It was a fun Saturday night race. We just got to go out and have some fun.”

Collin Moyle tested the turn one wall with a series of flips to start the 18-lap 360 feature. He walked away. When the green flew again, Ryan Giles set the pace, ahead of Josh Higday and Kaleb Johnson. Jamie Ball was quickly in the conversation, taking fourth by the second lap. The leaders were in lapped traffic by the sixth circuit. That’s when Ball moved by Johnson for third.

Ricky Montgomery spun seven laps in, setting up a restart that had Giles leading Higday, Ball, Johnson and Clint Garner back to green. Johnson’s streak of bad luck continued when he slowed with mechanical issues on the restart. In the meantime, Ball had moved by Higday for second.

At the halfway point, Ball worked by Giles to take the lead. Garner moved up to third, and on lap ten, Kelby Watt, who started in row seven, was fourth.

Ball was back into lapped traffic with five to go, but was never seriously challenged the rest of the way. Giles settled for second, ahead of Garner, the hard-charger Watt and Nate Mills. Jack Dover, Calvin Landis, Matt Moro, Higday and Christopher Thram completed the top ten. Mills set quick time over the field, while Thram, Dover and Giles won heats.

“This one is for Wade, Angie and Nate at Keizer Wheels,” said Ball in Victory Lane. “They just lost their business in a fire this week and he’s supported me since my first laps here. The Dunkin’s are incredible. This track was absolutely perfect tonight, and that car was absolutely perfect. I was just the lucky one that got to drive it.”

The 15-lap Pro Sprints presented by Pace Performance main event got off to a rocky start when front row starters Alex Vande Voort and Scotty Johnson got together in turn one. The result was Johnson taking a nasty ride into the turn one wall. He walked away. Brandon Worthington also tipped over trying to avoid the fray, and was done for the night.

Once green, it was all Devin Wignall, as he led the distance. He entered lapped traffic with three to go, and was never headed. Eric Bridger challenged early and settled for second, followed by Tyler Groenendyk, who passed Vande Voort for third coming for the white flag. Chase Young, Matthew Stelzer, Mike Mayberry, Jeff Wilke, Devin Kline and JJ Beaver rounded out the top ten. Mayberry and Bridger were heat race winners. Tyler Barrick was a scratch for the night after tipping over in his heat. He was uninjured.

“I can’t thank my crew enough,” said Wignall in Victory Lane. “Early part of the season, we’ve been struggling a bit, but last week and this week we’ve had it spot on. I started running the top early on. I saw how many marbles were being kicked into the middle. A lot of people were down low. I went down low a couple laps and stuck it pretty good, so I rolled that for the rest of the race.”

Gio Scelzi Scintillating at Knoxville!

Clint Garner Makes Hodnett/Swindell Tribute Pay Off in 360's; Matthew Stelzer Scores Again in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (June 5, 2021) – Gio Scelzi led wire to wire to garner his third career win at the Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. The Fresno, California native earned \$5,000 for his win aboard the KCP Racing #18. Clint Garner whose car fashioned a tribute to 1990's Two Winners teammates Jeff Swindell and Greg Hodnett (who were both inducted in the National Sprint Car Hall of Fame Saturday), won for the 42nd time in the 360 class. Matthew Stelzer scored his third win of the season in the Pace Performance Pro Sprints feature.

Scelzi and Anthony Macri battled for the lead going into turns one and two to begin the 20-lap 410 feature, but it was Scelzi who took command. Kerry Madsen was quickly in the equation and after a good battle with Macri, took the runner-up spot on lap four. Brian Brown also shot by Macri for third on lap five.

Scelzi was in lapped traffic by the sixth circuit, extending his lead over Madsen. Madsen reeled in the leader a bit, but never seriously challenged the quick cushion riding Californian. Brown maintained third, but it was not easy. At the halfway point, Austin McCarl began advancing through the field at a good pace. He challenged Brown in a drag race for the checkers, but settled for fourth. Macri, Lynton Jeffrey, hard-charger Shane Golobic, Davey Heskin, Sam Hafertepe Jr. and Ayrton Gennetten rounded out the top ten.

Madsen set quick time over the 29-car field that saw several visitors, including some paying tribute to Greg Hodnett's induction into the National Sprint Car Hall of Fame, including Chase Dietz aboard the John Trone #39 (Hodnett's former ride), the Heffner #27 (another Hodnett ride) driven by Tim Shaffer, who was inducted as well on Saturday, and Macri. Madsen, Brown and Jeffrey won heats, while Shaffer took the B.

"I feel like I haven't been here in years," said Scelzi in Victory Lane. "My car was awesome. I knew Macri was going to go to the bottom of one and two and slide me. He slid me and cleared me (on lap one), but I knew I had to get going on the top. I tried to put a whole race together...that's definitely what I've been struggling with this year. Wins like this get you motivated to win more."

Clint Garner's normal #40 sprint car featured a split paint scheme featuring the #7TW and the #8TW of 1990's Two Winners teammates Jeff Swindell and Greg Hodnett, who were both inducted Saturday into the National Sprint Car Hall of Fame. He was a man on a mission on Saturday.

Garner didn't waste his opportunity starting on the pole and shot to the fore immediately. Last week's winner, Jamie Ball, settled into second, ahead of Dylan Westbrook, Ryan Giles and Calvin Landis. Garner was in lapped traffic by lap six, and continued to extend his lead.

The 18-lapper went non-stop, with Garner working traffic efficiently, and never being challenged. Westbrook made a surge in traffic late, and shot by Ball for second with two laps to go. Ball settled for third, ahead of Giles and JJ Hickle, who made a late move for fifth. Landis, Josh Higday, Lee Grosz, Matt Moro and Ricky Montgomery completed the top ten. New National Sprint Car Hall of Fame inductee, Jeff Swindell was the hard-charger. Westbrook set quick time over the 28-car field, and Giles, Moro and Ball were heat winners. Christian Bowman won the B.

"Greg (Hodnett) was with me," said Garner in Victory Lane. "I thought about it earlier today, and I thought I have a guest with me tonight. I'm out there leading the race, and I'm saying, 'C'mon Greg, let's do this.' (Robert) Hubbard's in town, and he's the reason I knew Greg Hodnett. He's been flying into town keeping an eye on us, and he and my brother tag-teamed it...the car was perfect!"

Matthew Stelzer utilized a quick low side of the track to lead early in the 15-lap Pro Sprints feature over Devin Wignall, Matt Allen, Devin Kline and Jeff Wilke. While Stelzer pulled away. Wignall (high side) and Allen (low side) battled for the runner-up spot most of the event. It would prove to be the best battle on the track, as Stelzer was gone.

Stelzer entered lapped traffic and had to move higher on the track. It wouldn't matter as he went on to win his class-best fifteenth main event. Wignall finally secured second with two to go, followed by Allen, hard-charger Chase Young and Devin Kline, who gained fifth on the last lap. Wilke, Brandon Worthington, Tyler Groenendyk, Mike Mayberry and Alex Vande Voort rounded out the top ten. Eric Bridger and Worthington were heat winners.

"My guys gave me a great car," said Stelzer in Victory Lane. "They drew an eight pill (for feature inversion) that gave us the luck to start on the front row. We haven't been good in the heat race. We have to get better there. We've got a good car come feature time when it slicks off."

The Pace Performance Pro Sprints will compete on Friday, and the 360 class will be on the card Saturday! Carson Macedo Fires First Shot in Knoxville's Brownell's Big Guns Bash!

Devin Kline Leads Wire to Wire in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (June 12, 2021) – Carson Macedo's first 410 win at the Knoxville Raceway was a big one as he took the \$10,000 win on the first night of the Brownell's Big Guns Bash featuring the NOS Energy Drink World of Outlaws Friday night. The Lemoore, California native's win came aboard the Jason Johnson Racing #41. Devin Kline scored his fourteenth career win by leading flag to flag in the main event for the Pace Performance Pro Sprints.

Kerry Madsen, who had won his heat and the Dash, was looking good early in the 25-lap WoO feature. Macedo chased him in second, ahead of Donny Schatz, Brad Sweet and Logan Schuchart. Macedo challenged on lap three, but Madsen maintained his advantage until entering lapped traffic on the seventh circuit.

With Madsen in heavy lapped traffic, Macedo tried a daring move that fell short on lap eleven. Madsen was able to stretch his advantage aboard the Tony Stewart Racing #14. Schuchart put plenty of pressure on Sweet for fourth and made a pass on lap 16 before Scott Bogucki contacted McKenna Haase in turn three with five laps to go, bringing the races only caution.

Madsen led the charge back to green, ahead of Macedo, Schatz, Schuchart and Sweet. After trailing Madsen for a full lap, Macedo shot to the bottom of turn one on the 22nd circuit and slid into the lead. Schuchart passed Schatz for third as well and coming for the white flag flew by Madsen for second. Following Macedo, Schuchart and Madsen at the checkers, were Schatz and Gio Scelzi who claimed fifth on the last lap. Sweet,

David Gravel, Brian Brown, Aaron Reutzel and Ayrton Gennetten rounded out the top ten. Kasey Kahne and Schuchart set quick time over their respective groups, while Schatz, Brown, Schuchart and Madsen won heat races. Madsen took the Dash, and Matt Juhl claimed the B main.

“It was just a hard race,” said Macedo in Victory Lane. “Kerry was doing a good job of maneuvering in and out of traffic. A couple times, I thought I’d have a run on him, and lapped cars would zig or zag the wrong way. It just wouldn’t work out for me. When I saw the caution, I thought it was going to be tough to get a good start. I was able to get a good start and hit the bottom. I’m excited! It’s so hard to win here...it’s so technical. You have to hit your marks, and it’s really easy to make mistakes. My car was so good...when I did make a mistake it recovered for me.”

“I could tell (Macedo) didn’t feel comfortable in three and four,” said the late closing Schuchart. “(The bottom) was a place I really thought I could gain some ground on some guys. I just felt some other cars’ tails were wagging in and out there at the end. When they start dancing that way, it’s a sign their tires might be going away. It’s always fun when you can race around this place, Knoxville Raceway. It’s the best in the business. A run like that...passing some heavy hitters like we did...it means a lot. Hopefully, we can build on it, and get a little bit better.”

“This car is fast,” said Madsen of his third place run. “I was feeling really comfortable. We had a yellow, and I thought that would actually help us. I just didn’t make the right adjustments. I feel like I let the boys down, but this is a great racecar. Things change on the yellow, and you have to make the right adjustments, but I learned a lot, and I’m enjoying this car a lot. We’re still glad to get a podium...on to tomorrow night.”

Devin Kline shot out from his pole position in the 15-lap Pace Performance Pro Sprints feature, ahead of Brandon Worthington, Matthew Stelzer, Mike Mayberry and Tyler Barrick. With the track yielding two and three good grooves, the top five did not change until Barrick slowed and exited, ending his top five run with three laps to go.

Kline held his advantage the last three laps, with Stelzer capturing second on the restart, ahead of Worthington. Tyler Groenendyk shot from seventh to gain fourth at the line after starting eleventh, and Mike Mayberry was fifth. Chase Young, Alex Vande Voort, Cam Martin, Jeff Wilke and Matt Allen completed the top ten. Kline and Barrick won the heat races. Devin Wignall flipped hard down the backstretch in his heat race after contact with another car. When the red light came out, Ryan Navratil rode over the rear of Groenendyk’s car and flipped as well. Both drivers walked away under their own power, but were done for the night.

“That was hands down, the best car we’ve had all year,” said Kline in Victory Lane. “We have to thank Wayne Johnson. We had his shocks on tonight. We want to get a mid-season stride going, and we can’t thank everyone enough.”



**Carson Macedo Sweeps Brownell’s Big Guns Bash with Last Lap Theatrics at Knoxville!
Dylan Westbrook Wins Last Lap Thriller in the 360 Class As Well

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (June 12, 2021) – Carson Macedo pulled off a sweep of the Brownell’s Big Guns Bash weekend featuring the NOS Energy Drink World of Outlaws at Knoxville Raceway. Saturday night, the Lemoore, California native used a last lap pass of Kerry Madsen to claim the win worth \$10,000 aboard the Jason Johnson Racing #41. Dylan Westbrook won the 360 main event in similar fashion, a last lap pass. His win came aboard the Hill’s Racing #47x.

Macedo took off from his pole starting spot ahead of Madsen, Gio Scelzi, Aaron Reutzel and Parker Price-Miller. Sheldon Haudenschild entered the top five on lap three before Brock Zearfoss tumbled hard in turn three. He was uninjured.

Macedo chose the inside line on the double-file restart, and stretched his advantage. Haudenschild used the opportunity to gain fourth. Madsen gained on the leader and circled Macedo on the high side of turn four to take the point on lap six. Four circuits later, he was entering lapped traffic.

Haudenschild gained momentum as well, passing Scelzi for third on lap twelve. On lap 17, he reached Macedo and passed him for the runner-up spot. Macedo would come back, however, capitalizing on a mistake by Haudenschild as the track yielded to rubber-down conditions on the bottom.

Madsen's line on the bottom seemed to loosen, and Macedo gained on him late. Entering turn two of the final lap, he raced under the leader to snatch the win and a sweep of the weekend. Haudenschild held onto third, ahead of Scelzi and Logan Schuchart. Reutzel, Brent Marks, James McFadden, Parker Price-Miller and Brian Brown rounded out the top ten. Scelzi and Schuchart set quick times in their respective groups, and both were joined by Macedo and Schuchart as heat winners. Macedo won the Dash and Scott Bogucki claimed the B.

"I feel like my racecar was really good the whole event there," said Macedo in Victory Lane. "I didn't know where to run at times. I'm thinking I'm plugging pretty good laps around the bottom there, and Kerry got a lane up there working and got by me. In traffic, he was superb. I couldn't quite get through there as well. There at the end, Sheldon got by me, and I plugged the bottom of three and four really nice trying to get back by him. I realized how much better it was, if I was a little more patient and stayed down a little bit longer. When I got back up to Kerry, I realized he was making the same mistake...he was fading out. I plugged the bottom really well, and was trying to set him up to pass him in three and four. It just worked out that he slid up out of the bottom (in turn two)."

"I kind of got really tight there in dirty air," said Madsen. "When I made a move on one of the Kahne cars, it was pretty aggressive in the rubber, and I thought we should be ok. I should have brought that home for sure. This car is so fun to drive. I feel like I let the boys and the team down on this one, but I think we can get some."

"The guys have been working really hard," said Haudenschild. "They have me feeling really good here. I feel like we had a good half of the race, and we were there at the end. There's not much more you can ask for. I made a mistake and Carson capitalized. I'll just learn and keep ripping. I feel like we have a good base, and we'll move along from there."

Ryan Giles led early in the 18-lap 360 main event over Carson McCarl, Clint Garner, Dylan Westbrook and Ricky Montgomery. Jamie Ball quickly entered the top five, and when Westbrook bobbed on the bottom of turn two on the third lap, took fourth. Westbrook also surrendered fifth to Josh Higday, but recovered the following lap to regain that spot.

Giles entered lapped traffic on lap six, and slowed a bit on lap seven. McCarl pounced to take the lead and pull away. Meanwhile, Westbrook was regaining his momentum and somehow fit between Ball and the wall above the turn three cushion to recover fourth on lap ten.

Westbrook was a man on a mission on the cushion, and pulled a slider to pass Garner for third on lap 12. He reeled in Giles, getting by him coming for the white flag. McCarl would slow a bit in traffic on lap seventeen, and after crossing the white flag, Westbrook shot through the middle of turns one and two to claim the lead and win the race to the checkers.

Westbrook, from Scotland, Ontario, became the second Canadian to win a 360 main event at Knoxville, joining Thomas Kennedy from Winnipeg, Manitoba. McCarl, Giles, Ball and Garner followed. Roger Crockett, Higday, Kaleb Johnson, Scott Bogucki and Montgomery completed the top ten. Westbrook set quick time, and Ball and Higday won heat races.

"That was really good," said Westbrook in Victory Lane. "At the end of the race, I found a little rubber in the middle of the track right at the perfect time. It really worked out for us. We've been on a pretty good roll lately and have a bunch of podiums. It's great to finally get a win here. We struggled here a lot...to come here and win is great!"

**Jamie Ball and Carson McCarl Win 360 Barnburners at Knoxville!
Devin Kline and Eric Bridger Add to Their Win Totals in the Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (June 18, 2021) – A thrilling quartet of races greeted Knoxville Raceway fans Friday night as four different drivers celebrated victory! Jamie Ball won his ninth career feature in the 360 class after starting tenth, and executing a late race pass. In a make-up feature from May 15, Carson McCarl made an electrifying last lap pass to gain his fifth career win. In the Pro Sprints presented by Pace Performance class, Devin Kline notched career win number 15, while Eric Bridger won his tenth career main event in the make-up feature.

Pole-sitter Calvin Landis shot out to the early lead in the first 18-lap 360 main event ahead of Sawyer Phillips and Austin McCarl. Christian Bowman would slow to a stop after contact with Cody Ledger. Bowman would exit with damage to the left front of the car. At the same time, Chris Martin suffered motor ills while running seventh and retired.

Landis led Phillips, Austin McCarl, Riley Goodno and Carson McCarl back to green. Clint Garner quickly entered the top five and then took fourth from Goodno on lap three.

Up front, Phillips was gaining on the leader and took the point with a pass of Landis on the high side of turn four on lap five. Meanwhile, Jamie Ball had advanced from his starting spot outside row five into the top five. Ball would go by Garner on the high side on lap six for fourth.

On lap ten, Phillips was caught behind a lapper and Landis pounced to retake the lead. Two laps later, Phillips would pull to the infield with mechanical issues. Ball worked his way by Austin McCarl and set his sights on the leader as the laps dwindled down. With three to go, he made his winning pass on the high side of turn four. Austin McCarl claimed the second spot coming for the white flag.

Ball's ninth career win came ahead of Austin McCarl, Landis, hard-charger Roger Crockett and Garner. Carson McCarl, Ryan Giles, Goodno, AJ Moeller and Kaleb Johnson rounded out the top ten. Garner set quick time over the 31-car field, while Austin McCarl, Giles and Josh Higday were heat race winners. Ryan Leavitt claimed the B main.

"We struggled a little bit in the heat race and the boys went to work," said Ball in Victory Lane. "We changed things two or three different times depending on how the track looked. We worked through adversity tonight, and tenth to first...that was awesome!"

The 18-lap make-up feature for the 360's got off to a rough start when Rob Kubli contacted the turn two wall, and was done. From there though, the race went clean and green.

Ryan Giles came from row two to lead early over Ricky Montgomery, Carson McCarl, Johnson and Garner. On lap four, McCarl and Johnson found their way by Montgomery for second and third, while Garner would follow them into fourth a lap later.

The leaders were into lapped traffic by the eighth circuit, and Ball had entered the top five after starting in row six on lap nine. McCarl slowly reeled in Giles as traffic developed and briefly took the lead on the 17th lap. Giles would reclaim it by the start/finish line.

Heading into the final lap, McCarl shot low into turn one and slid in front of Giles to take the lead for good and claim his fifth career 360 feature win. Johnson, Garner and Ball followed Giles to the line. Leavitt, Matt Moro, Montgomery, Landis and Goodno completed the top ten.

"I just let one get away from me last week," said McCarl in Victory Lane. "I felt really good up on the top, and the few times I went to the bottom, I felt good as well. I knew I was catching (Giles) on the top and I had a big run off of four. I didn't want to show my nose too soon. My car felt so good, but I don't know if we were as good as he was. To get a win at Knoxville is awesome, especially in a fashion like that."

The first feature for the Pro Sprints saw JJ Beaver get into the turn one wall right after the green. He was done for the night. Devin Kline took off from his pole spot once the green replaced the yellow as Joe Beaver moved from the third row to second, ahead of Devin Wignall.

Jaelyn Jones spun with six laps down, setting up a restart that saw Kline ahead of Beaver, Wignall, Tyler Groenendyk and Matt Allen. Matthew Stelzer, who led the point race heading into the night, came to a stop one lap later. Wignall used that restart to gain second in a quest to catch the leader.

One final caution flew for a slowing Jeff Wilke with two to go. Kline was able to maintain his advantage and match Stelzer's 15-win mark that sits on the top of the class's all-time victory list. Groenendyk shot by Beaver and Wignall to grab second, followed by Wignall, Beaver and Mike Mayberry. Allen, Chase Young, Eric Bridger, Brandon Worthington and Cam Martin rounded out the top ten. Young and Wignall won heat races.

"I was getting worried on all the restarts," said Kline in Victory Lane. "On the second one, I saw Joe Beaver get beside me. It was a lot of fun getting to race with him. The (second to last) restart, I saw Wignall was up there on the top and I got worried. Nonetheless, this car has been on rails the last two weeks in a row. I'm having a blast!"

Bridger shot out to the early lead in the 18-lap make-up feature, ahead of Alex Vande Voort and Wignall. Groenendyk made a move from sixth to fourth, but it was negated when Stelzer came to stop a lap in. He would take fifth on the restart, and then move into fourth on lap four.

On lap six, Wignall rode the high side to second ahead of Vande Voort. Wignall reeled in Bridger, who was using the low side of the track and passed him high in turn four on lap ten. Meanwhile, Groenendyk took third from Vande Voort.

Wignall was cruising, but a caution for a spun Wilke set up a two lap dash for the checkers. Bridger took advantage, getting a great restart on the bottom to move by Wignall and take his tenth career win at Knoxville. Wignall, Groenendyk, Vande Voort and Mayberry followed. Worthington, Young, Allen and Martin completed the top ten.

"It's been a couple years since we've been up front, but I'll take it," said Bridger in Victory Lane. "I saw (Wignall) closing down on me on the video board. So I tried to get higher and that screwed me up. With the caution, I thought I needed five more laps, but it actually worked out. I was able to pull the wing back and drive off."

Tony Stewart Wins First Feature Ever by Topping Camping World Superstar Racing Experience Feature!

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (June 19, 2021) – Tony Stewart has spent more time than most car owners in Victory Lane at Knoxville Raceway, but Saturday night it was his turn to visit as a driver. The Columbus, Indiana native won against a star-studded Camping World Superstar Racing Experience (SRX) field. National Sprint Car Hall of Fame inductee, Guy Forbrook, was Tony’s crew chief tonight. He added a win to his 89 career sprint car tallies with his wrench at the famed half-mile.

Stewart led the 50-lap feature to green early over Ernie Francis Jr. and former Knoxville Late Model Nationals winner Scott Bloomquist. Bloomquist passed Francis for second on lap four before the first caution of the race flew for debris. Unfortunately, for former Indy car pilot Paul Tracy, his night ended at that point with an overheating engine.

The restart saw Bloomquist take second on the restart and set his sights on Stewart. The next caution flew for a spun Brian Brown, who collected four-time Indy 500 winner, Helio Castroneves. Both would restart.

Michael Waltrip used the double-file restart to go from fifth to third, while Hailie Deegan shot up to fourth. A Brown spin eight laps in set up another restart that saw Deegan get from fourth to second. Waltrip would work back by Deegan for second on lap ten, and he started gaining on Stewart.

Using the low side of turn four, Waltrip would take the point on lap 14. While Waltrip rode the low side, Stewart maintained a groove in the middle of the track to retake the lead on lap 21. Francis returned to the top three on lap 24 with a pass of Deegan.

Bloomquist was working his way back up through the field after getting four wheels above the cushion earlier, but a top five run ended when Castroneves tapped his rear-end, causing him to spin. It would prove to be the last caution.

Francis got under Waltrip for second, and Castroneves moved into third. Deegan moved by Waltrip for fourth on lap 34. Deegan's charge continued as she came on late, passing Castroneves for third with seven to go and working by Francis on the last lap for second.

Stewart cruised the last 20 laps to win ahead of Deegan, Francis, hard-charger Castroneves and Waltrip. Bobby Labonte, Marco Andretti, Brown, Bloomquist and Willy T. Ribbs rounded out the top ten. Stewart and Bloomquist won heat races.

"It's the first time I've been in Victory Lane at Knoxville (as a driver)," said Stewart. "This is where I've watched Donny Schatz and Steve Kinser, and the greatest of the greats in sprint car racing. This is the place I've always wanted to be, so that's pretty cool. This is the 'Sprint Car Capital of the World.' We've been to two different surfaces in two weeks, and Ray Evernham built one hell of a racecar. I think we saw that tonight. This place is challenging and it's tough. I thought if Michael Waltrip beats me on a dirt track, I'm going to have to go through therapy for three straight weeks. Michael ran a hell of a race and so did Ernie Francis...two guys that don't have a lot of dirt experience."

"Honestly, that was so much fun," said Deegan. "My goal coming into this race was proving to everyone that I deserved to be here. I feel like we did that tonight. Running second to Tony Stewart is a huge accomplishment. These cars are so much fun. I felt like I ran a clean race, got around the bottom, stayed consistent and ran my line."

"It wasn't too bad for my second ever dirt race," said Francis. "We were just kind of riding around there and saving our tires as much as we could. The car wasn't as good in the feature as it was in the heat races. I was trying to keep the back end underneath me. I was trying to get to Tony's bumper to get by him, and it was fun battling with Hailie. I was happy with that one. I can't wait to get to the next race."

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (June 19, 2021) – Kerry Madsen followed his car owner, Tony Stewart, as a winner Saturday night at the Knoxville Raceway. Stewart had won the Camping World Superstar Racing Experience (SRX) presented by Xstream powered by Mediacom main event earlier in the night. The St. Mary’s, New South Wales, Australia native’s win aboard the Tony Stewart Racing #14 was worth \$4,000.

Brian Brown shot out to the lead on lap one of the 20-lap main event, but Madsen was hot on his heels, sliding in front to lead lap two. Don Droud Jr. was third, ahead of Lynton Jeffrey and Ayrton Gennetten.

By lap five, Madsen was in lapped traffic and his lead had grown to 2.7 seconds over Brown. Gennetten shot by Jeffrey into fourth on lap six. Things went clean and green, and Madsen’s lead had swelled to 3.7 second at the halfway point.

At that stage, the track began to change, taking some rubber. Brown found it first and reeled in the leader, closing to a 1.4 second gap with five to go.

It would not matter as Madsen would score his 24th career victory (12th on the all-time list) ahead of Brown, Droud, Gennetten and Jeffrey. Austin McCarl, Justin Henderson, Tasker Phillips, Chris Martin and Matt Juhl rounded out the top ten. Madsen set quick time over the 27-car field, and Austin McCarl, Tasker Phillips and Sawyer Phillips won the heats.

“The Knoxville track crew guys did a good job of getting the track turned around (after the SRX) and giving us a good track to race on,” said Madsen in Victory Lane. “I love these Ford engines. I’m just having a great time. This car with Ricky Warner wrenching it is such a fun car to drive. (Stewart) did remind me that a win was expected. When you have a car that good, you don’t have much pressure...you just drive it hard and see what it’s got.”

Justin Henderson Provides the Fireworks for \$5,000 at Knoxville!
Cory Eliason Makes Late Pass for Second Career 360 Win; Eric Bridger Wins Second in a Row in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (July 3, 2021) – Justin Henderson led wire to wire to claim the \$5,000 410 main event at the Knoxville Raceway Saturday on Budweiser Salutes America Night. His win was the first of the season for he and the Sandvig Motorsports #7 team, and the twelfth of his career here. Cory Eliason passed Ryan Giles late in the 360 feature to win his second career win here, and Eric Bridger led the duration of the Pace Performance Pro Sprints for his second victory in a row, and eleventh in his career.

Henderson took advantage of a “zero” draw for the heat inversion and led from the pole early in the 25-lap 410 feature, ahead of Davey Heskin, Lynton Jeffrey, Matt Juhl and Brian Brown. Austin McCarl was an early player as well, jetting from sixth to third on the second lap. Brown tried to slide by Juhl for fifth, and the latter went four wheels above the cushion, spinning to a stop.

McCarl disposed of Heskin for second on the restart, while Brown moved to fourth. Cory Eliason moved into the top five on lap five. Brown’s charge netted third on lap seven in a good battle with Heskin. The leaders hit lapped traffic on the tenth circuit, and McCarl pressured Henderson for the lead. He shot by for the point, but a caution for Jeffrey, who got over the turn one cushion and into the wall negated his pass.

Brown would add to McCarl’s misfortune, jetting by for second on the restart. Contact from another car sent Tasker Phillips into a hard flip on the twelfth lap. Joe Simbro also tipped over. Neither was injured. All Star regulars Eliason and Tyler Courtney moved into fourth and fifth on the restart, with Eliason gaining another spot with a pass of McCarl on lap 14. Heskin followed him into fourth a pair of laps later. A top ten run for Sammy Swindell ended in smoke and he came to a stop with four to go. Ninth running Ian Madsen entered the work area as well.

Up front, Henderson was true to the bottom and never headed. Brown finished second, ahead of Eliason, Heskin and McCarl. Ayrton Gennetten, Courtney, Sawyer Phillips, Terry McCarl and Juhl rounded out the top ten. Henderson set quick time over the field, and Austin McCarl, Riley Goodno and Jeffrey were heat winners.

“I was definitely holding on with the nose wing laying back the way it was,” said Henderson in Victory Lane. “I was really worried, and I figured if I kept nipping the bottom...I didn’t see anyone above me. That was the story of the race. We got a quick lead, and after that it was just hang on to the bottom and try not to miss it. The car would get so tight, and then I would try to have to save it or let it run up the hill. I was hearing cars on either side, so I was just hoping for the best. With 900 horsepower, it was tough to keep the nose down. This team never quits working.”

Ryan Giles shot out from the pole to lead Kaleb Johnson, Jamie Ball, Cory Eliason and Calvin Landis early in the 20-lap 360 main event. Eliason copped third from Ball on lap two, before Giles entered lapped traffic four circuits later.

Eliason’s climb continued when he got by Johnson for second in traffic on lap seven. Shortly after, John Anderson lost his right rear tire bringing the yellow flag. Giles led Eliason, Johnson, Ball and Landis back to the green flag.

The leader was back in the backmarkers by lap 13. Alan Zoutte spun with two laps to go, setting up a final dash for the checkers, and a chance for Eliason to catch Giles.

Eliason would make his winning pass high in turn two after the restart to take the win, his first of the year in the Rudeen Racing #26. Giles held onto second, ahead of Ball, Clint Garner and Johnson. Landis, Brooke Tatnell, Matt Moro, Riley Goodno and Ricky Montgomery completed the top ten. Eliason set quick time over the 25-car field, while Tatnell, Connor Loeffler and Ball took the heats.

“We were close, and when we got in lapped traffic, we kept getting a yellow,” said Eliason. “That’s good if you’re the leader, but as the second place guy, I was getting frustrated. We had a restart (on lap seven) and (Giles) lifted a little early getting to the bottom. So I just had to time my start right with him. I had the run down the straightaway and I was able to use the middle in free air.”

The Pace Performance Pro Sprints 15-lap feature was one of attrition that only saw seven finish the event. Devin Kline and Cam Martin didn’t even make the post after flipping in their heat race. Both were uninjured. Lap one of the main event claimed another five cars. When Brandon Worthington contacted, a chain reaction

saw Matt Allen, Tyler Barrick, Alex Vande Voort and Jaslyn Jones get collected. Only Mayberry would continue.

Once green, Eric Bridger led in his patented low groove, ahead of Devin Wignall, Matthew Stelzer, Joe Beaver and Tyler Groenendyk. Groenendyk and Jeff Wilke would move past Beaver into fourth and fifth. Joe would exit on lap eight.

With Bridger appearing to be well on his way to a win, JJ Beaver spun with a lap to go. Wignall, who was running second, could not avoid Beaver's car and was collected. Both were uninjured.

The green, white, checker finish was anticlimactic as Bridger roared to his second straight win, and the eleventh of his career on the famous half-mile. Stelzer, Groenendyk, Mayberry, Chase Young, Wilke and Scotty Johnson were the remaining cars running. Wilke and Wignall were heat race winners.

"It was perfect for about ten laps, and then got a little loose there," said Bridger. "We got the caution, I pulled the wing back a bit, and set sail into Victory Lane! Thanks to everyone for being here tonight, first responders and veterans too."

Austin Hill survives overtime, wins inaugural Truck Series race at Knoxville

At the end of a remarkable race on an equally remarkable race track, Austin Hill took home the trophy in Friday night's Corn Belt 150 presented by Premier Chevy Dealers at Knoxville Raceway.

After a fourth attempt at overtime in the inaugural NASCAR Truck Series event at the iconic .5-mile dirt track, Hill scored his first victory of the season in a race that featured 14 cautions and a 17-car pileup in Turn 1 that could rival even the biggest "Big One" at Talladega.

Moments after Hill took the checkered flag to end the fourth overtime, fireworks exploded in Turn 3, but they bore pale comparison with the pyrotechnics that punctuated a race that extended 29 laps past its scheduled distance of 150 circuits.

The decisive moment was much more subtle. After a Lap 171 restart—the third-overtime—Hill nosed ahead of Chandler Smith, who had done yeoman work on old tires and led seven times for a race-high 71 laps.

A four-car incident involving Tyler Ankrum, Stewart Friesen, Zane Smith and Johnny Sauter caused the final caution, with Hill having led at the previous scoring loop. That was all Hill needed to hold the point from the inside lane on the final overtime restart.

Two laps later, he crossed the finish line 1.207 seconds ahead of a disappointed Smith, who saw his chance to escape the NCWTS Playoffs bubble with a win evaporate in the last shootout.

The victory was the seventh of Hill's career.

“Man, I thought we were out of it,” said an elated Hill, who had shown speed throughout the race but fell back from the second position after a restart on Lap 73. “I thought we were out of it for a little bit. I had that restart outside of the 38 (Todd Gilliland) earlier in the race, and I fell back all the way to like 20th.

“I didn't think we were going to make it back up. Track position was huge. It was really hard to get around people—you had to kind of rough 'em up a little bit to get around 'em. But we don't stop, we don't quit, even when we think we're down and out.”

With the victory, Hill clinched a spot in the Playoffs. Smith, on the other hand, will have to sweat out the final regular-season race Aug. 7 at Watkins Glen, though he holds a relatively comfortable 40-point lead over Derek Kraus for the final playoff berth.

Kraus won the first and second stages Friday and finished fifth by avoiding most of the chaos at the end of the race.

The 17-truck crash ignited in Turn 1 seconds after the field took the green flag for the first overtime on Lap 154. Among the many victims was 10-time Knoxville Nationals winner and 10-time World of Outlaws champion Donny Schatz, who was making his NCWTS debut.

“I had nowhere to go—I was just along for the ride,” Schatz said. “I thought I was going to have a top-10 finish.”

Schatz instead finished 32nd. The best result achieved by a dirt-track ace was eighth by Knoxville Raceway track champion Brian Brown, who fell two laps down after a pair of spins but regained the lead lap as the beneficiary under consecutive cautions and managed to escape the third-stage melees.

Grant Enfinger ran third, followed by Gilliland and Kraus. Matt Crafton, Ben Rhodes, Brown, Tate Fogleman and Danny Bohn completed the top 10.

Note: When Stewart and Jessica Friesen took the green flag on Friday night, it marked the first time since Elton Sawyer and Patty Moise raced together at Atlanta in 1998 that a husband and wife have competed in the same NASCAR national series event. They finished together—Jessica in 26th and Stewart in 27th.

NOTE: The race-winning No. 16 Hattori Racing Enterprises Toyota of Austin Hill passed NASCAR's post-race inspection, confirming the victory. There were no issues.

Justin Henderson Brings Home the Beef, the Pork and \$7,000 at Knoxville!
Tyler Groenendyk Wins in Pro Sprints from the Tail; Todd Cooney Sweeps DTRA Trucks

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (July 17, 2021) – For the third time in his career at Knoxville Raceway, Justin Henderson swept both the 410 and 360 features in a single night. The stakes were high Saturday on Van Wall Equipment/Marion County Fair Night as the Tea, South Dakota native not only took home a total of \$7,000 for his feat, but also claimed a half beef for winning the 410 feature, and a half a hog for winning the 360 main event. Tyler Groenendyk stormed from the back of the Pace Performance Pro Sprints field to win his third feature of the year in that class, while Todd Cooney swept the two features with the Karl Chevrolet Dirt Truck Racing Association Series.

Ayrton Gennetten stormed out to an early lead in the 20-lap 410 feature, ahead of Carson McCarl and Lynton Jeffrey. Henderson was fourth by the fourth lap. Up front, Gennetten was putting a large margin between himself and the field as he entered lapped traffic on the fifth circuit.

When Riley Goodno contacted the turn one wall at the halfway point, Gennetten and McCarl had put over four seconds between themselves and the third place car of Jeffrey.

The restart saw new life for Henderson, who surged from fourth to second. Another stoppage for a tangle involving Austin Miller and Ben Brown two laps later, set up the restart Henderson really needed.

The driver of the Sandvig Motorsports #7 put a slider on Gennetten in turns three and four after the green fell. Gennetten stayed close, but a Presley Truedson flip with six to go assured Henderson clean air.

Henderson would pull away for his thirteenth 410 win here, followed by Gennetten, a late charging Austin McCarl, Carson McCarl and Davey Heskin. Jeffrey, Matt Juhl, AJ Moeller, Terry McCarl and Sawyer Phillips rounded out the top ten. Jeffrey set quick time, and Phillips, Henderson and Heskin won heats.

“Before we ever went out for the 360 feature, I had a great big smile on my face,” said Henderson in Victory Lane. “I knew we were going to be taking the right after the scales. I could already picture my boy coming up. I just had a big smile on my face. I knew it was a done deal. We did it twice. We’re going to go buy another freezer tomorrow! Ayrton is getting so good here. I was tickled pink to pass him and to beat him. He’s very, very good here. He’s got a lot of wins coming in his future. There’s a lot of good competition here. We’re very happy and proud of this team.”

Ricky Montgomery came to a stop at the beginning of the 20-lap 360 main event. Once underway, Jamie Ball led Christian Bowman and Henderson early. Bowman passed Ball on the high side of turn four to lead lap three, but Ball surged back by on the next circuit. Kaleb Johnson had a fast mount as well, gaining fourth from Ryan Giles on lap four.

Henderson used the low side to pass Bowman for second before Scott Bogucki came to a stop in turn two seven laps in. The caution came just as the leaders were approaching traffic.

Ball led Henderson, Bowman and Johnson back to green. Henderson used the high side of turn four to make his winning move, while Johnson took third after narrowly avoiding disaster and contact with Bowman.

The leaders were back in lapped traffic with five to go, but Johnson, who was challenging Ball for second, got over the turn one cushion and into the wall, ending his night.

Henderson led the group back to green, ahead of Ball, Juhl, Giles and Bowman. Giles took third, but Juhl roared back by a lap later. He would cruise on the low side to pass Ball for second, but had nothing for Henderson at the line.

Following Henderson and Juhl, were Ball, Giles and Clint Garner. Brooke Tatnell, Roger Crockett, Dylan Westbrook, Bowman and Ryan Leavitt completed the top ten. Henderson set quick time over the field, while Leavitt, Giles, Tatnell and Garret Williamson were heat winners. JJ Hickie claimed the B. Alan Zoutte spun in the second heat, collecting Alex Hill. Both were uninjured, but done for the night.C

“I just love this car,” said Henderson of the family #83 in Victory Lane. “It feels so good. We switched out cars at the end of last year, and I was a little worried this car wouldn’t act the same, but I love it. I didn’t get a good restart with five to go there. It jumped to the right and I spun and got back to the left. I thought Jamie...he’s so good at the bottom here, and I didn’t want to leave the bottom open for him. The top just felt better, we never same him and we never looked back.”

Brandon Worthington led the Pro Sprints feature early over Chase Young and Jeff Wilke. Meanwhile, Tyler Groenendyk got a tremendous start from outside row six and was fifth by the end of the first lap.

Young snuck by Worthington to lead lap two. Groenendyk shot from fifth to third on lap three before Scotty Johnson slowed with a flat left rear tire. Groenendyk disposed of Worthington to take second on the restart, while Mike Mayberry climbed to third in a battle with Worthington.

Up front, Young was cruising on the bottom, until he missed his marks with three to go. Groenendyk gained on him for a pair of laps before snatching the lead on the high side coming for the white flag.

Groenendyk's third win of the year came ahead of Young, Worthington, Mayberry and Devin Wignall. Wilke, Matt Allen, Alex Vande Voort, Eric Bridger and Joel Thorpe rounded out the top ten. Young and Allen won heat races.

"The track was good on the bottom of three and four, and you just had to be there," said Groenendyk in Victory Lane. "Thankfully, Chase started slowing down a little bit, and that opened the opportunity to start searching around. I think the bottom of one and two was getting narrower, and the top was starting to come in. We only made a half a lap in the heat race, and we had to go fix this thing. It wouldn't have happened if not for a lot of work behind the scenes."

Two 12-lap DTRA features were run. In the first, Shawn Cooney took the early advantage before a restart on lap two, saw former Knoxville Harris Clash modified winner, Bill Davis Jr., take over the lead. Former sprint car regular Jeff Johnson entered the top three on lap three, and worked by Todd Cooney for second on lap four.

It would turn into a three-way battle between Davis, Johnson and Todd Cooney for the win. Johnson led lap seven, before Cooney took over for good on lap eight.

Cooney's win came ahead of Johnson, Davis, Rick Clark and Shonn Mapes.

The former late model ace was even better in the second feature. Bryan Spangler led early, but Cooney had gone from tenth to third by the second lap. Johnson took the lead from Spangler, but it was short-lived. Cooney was in control by lap four.

Cooney's second victory came in front of Johnson, Davis, Dennis Plain and Spangler.

"We had a lot of fun tonight," said Cooney of his first two career wins at Knoxville. "We just decided to do this yesterday afternoon. I never thought I'd be making the left turn (into Victory Lane at Knoxville). This is pretty cool."

**Brian Brown Earns \$5,000 With Return to Victory Lane at Knoxville!
Clint Garner Paces 360 Field; Joe Beaver Grabs His First in Pro Sprints

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (July 24, 2021) – Brian Brown returned to Knoxville Raceway and led every lap to take home his 54th career win on 3M Race Night Saturday. The Grain Valley, Missouri native earned \$5,000 for his victory aboard the Brian Brown Racing #21. Clint Garner held off a stout 31-car 360 field for his 43rd win here. Joe Beaver won his first ever Pace Performance Pro Sprints feature with a late race pass.

The 25-lap 410 feature saw Brown shoot out from his pole position starting spot ahead of Lynton Jeffrey, Tasker Phillips, Justin Henderson and Davey Heskin. Henderson and Heskin moved by Phillips for third and fourth respectively, before the leaders entered lapped traffic on the sixth circuit.

Heskin gained momentum in traffic, disposing of both Henderson and Jeffrey on the low side to take over the second spot. Henderson would follow him into third on lap nine. Sawyer Phillips entered the top four on lap ten.

Brown continued to knife through traffic, while Austin McCarl gained momentum late in the race. He captured fourth from Sawyer Phillips on lap 15, rode the cushion around Henderson for third on lap 17, and passed Heskin in lapped traffic to take over the runner-up spot with six to go.

Brown was gone, winning by over three seconds, but the battle was on for second. Heskin regained his momentum on the low side and cruised back into the second spot by the checkers. McCarl was third, ahead of Henderson and Sawyer Phillips. Tasker Phillips, Matt Juhl, Terry McCarl, Lynton Jeffrey and Carson McCarl rounded out the top ten. Jeffrey set quick time, while Terry McCarl, AJ Moeller and Henderson won heats.

“Obviously, we had a good starting spot and that helps,” said Brown in Victory Lane. “We went to Eldora last week and learned a lot that I think really helped us. My hat’s off to (new crew chief) Danny (Lasoski), he just came on a week and a half ago. It’s crunch time. Every lap is very, very important. I don’t know how far I was ahead. I felt like I was making decent time in traffic, but not great. It doesn’t matter when you go to the bank on Monday.”

Like Brown, Clint Garner took off from the pole in the 18-lap 360 feature, with Josh Higday, Jeffrey, Matt Moro and Ryan Giles in tow. Jeffrey quickly moved into second, while Giles began a move forward, gaining fourth on lap three and moving into the top three on lap four.

Jack Dover advanced quickly from his starting spot in row six. He was into the top five five laps in, and took fourth a lap later, as the leaders entered lapped traffic.

On lap ten, Giles worked by Jeffrey for second, but Garner was splitting a pair of lappers to extend his advantage. Dover used the low side to move by Jeffrey on lap 13, before Kaleb Johnson spun to bring the only caution.

Garner took off again and was never headed, while Giles finished second. Jeffrey and Dover exchanged third twice in the late stages with Jeffrey grabbing the spot coming out of turn four on the final lap. Jamie Ball was fifth. Higday, Moro, Riley Goodno, Skylar Prochaska and Calvin Landis completed the top ten. Jeffrey also set quick time in the 360’s, and Garner, Dover and Prochaska were heat winners. Rob Kubli claimed the B.

“If (lapped traffic) was hard for me, it was hard for everybody,” said Garner in Victory Lane. “I kind of wanted to see (the caution), just to find out what kind of car we had. There were good cars behind us, and when you take off and run, you don’t really know. I’m happy, happy, happy! (The wins) are really hard to get.”

The 15-lap Pro Sprints feature saw Tyler Groenendyk lead from the pole ahead of Mike Mayberry, Joe Beaver, Devin Wignall and Eric Bridger. Groenendyk’s run would come to an end when his car went up in smoke four laps in.

Mayberry assumed the lead at that point. Cam Martin slowed seven laps in the books to bring the only caution. Mayberry led Beaver, Wignall, Bridger and Chase Young back to green. Wignall quickly pounced, moving into second, while Young moved up to fourth.

While Mayberry led, Beaver kept the pressure on Wignall for second. With three to go, he hit the low side of turn four to claim the second spot. That gave him serious momentum in running down Mayberry, and on the bottom of turns one and two, he made his winning move on lap 13.

Wignall made a last corner pass for the second spot, ahead of Mayberry, young and Alex Vande Voort. Jeff Wilke, Bridger, Brandon Worthington, Tyler Barrick and Scotty Johnson rounded out the top ten. Beaver and Mayberry were heat race winners.

“Unfortunately, we’re down (from the 360’s) with some motor issues,” said Beaver in Victory Lane. “It’s not cherry picking in this class I’ll tell you. They kicked my butt the first couple of times out with them. Every class here is competitive. I tried everything I could to give that race away. I don’t know how many times I jumped the berm. If anybody knows me, they know running the bottom was painful.”

**Kerry Madsen Wins All Star Thriller at Knoxville!
Gio Scelzi is Dominant with 360 Win**

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (July 31, 2021) – Kerry Madsen is hot at the right time. The St. Mary's, New South Wales, Australia native tied fellow countryman Skip Jackson on the all-time win list at Knoxville Raceway with his 25th victory Saturday on Weiler Night. The win came in a thrilling All Star Circuit of Champions event amongst a 46-car field, and paid the driver of the Tony Stewart Racing #14 \$7,000. Gio Scelzi had a rocket in the 40-car 360 field and topped the main event for his first win here in that class.

Spencer Bayston shot out from the pole to lead Madsen and Gio Scelzi early in the going in the 25-lap All Stars feature. Justin Henderson shot from sixth to fourth to join the lead quartet early on. Brian Brown moved by Paul McMahan to complete the top five by lap six.

The leaders entered lapped traffic on the seventh circuit, and Madsen closed on Bayston. On lap ten, Madsen briefly led, but Bayston regained the spot by the flag stand. Meanwhile, Scelzi was on top of both. He took second from Madsen on lap 12, and then slid in front of Bayston on lap 13 to take the point.

Madsen followed Scelzi into the second spot on the same lap, and set his sights on the new leader. On lap 16, he got a run on the low side of turn two, passing Scelzi and taking the lead. Shortly, thereafter, Scelzi slipped over the turn three cushion and lost the momentum he was building to battle back.

Henderson was running fourth on the seventeenth lap, when he slowed to a stop in turn four, bringing the only caution of the event. Madsen led Scelzi, Bayston, Brown and Austin McCarl back to green.

Up front, Madsen pulled away the final eight laps, while Bayston and Scelzi battled for the second spot. Bayston would nab the spot for good in turn two with four to go.

Following Madsen, Bayston and Scelzi, were Brown and Rico Abreu. Davey Heskin, Austin McCarl, Sam Hafertepe Jr., Tyler Courtney and hard-charger Parker Price-Miller. Abreu set quick time over the field, while Scelzi, Lynton Jeffrey, Ayrton Gennetten, Madsen and Brown won heats. Bayston and Paul McMahan won Dashes. Tasker Phillips claimed the C main, and Bill Balog took the B. A scary incident in the third heat race saw Sawyer Phillips and Sye Lynch get together and take a series of flips into turn two. The incident also collected Kasey Kahne. All three drivers were done for the night. Lynch was taken by ambulance for observation.

“We didn't really know where the predominant lines were going to be,” said Madsen in Victory Lane. “It was pretty tricky, and you could gain a spot, and lose a spot. I decided to calm down and just hit the bottom, and we were able to get back by a couple cars. From there we just stayed down there. We probably weren't the best we've been tonight, but it doesn't matter when you get the victory.”

“I felt I was setting a pretty good pace,” said Bayston of the early stages of the race. “I kept hearing them behind me, and when you get to traffic, you never know what's going to happen. If you make one slipup, these guys pounce. You have to be on your 'A game,' but I felt we did everything we needed to do...I just needed to race a little better in the traffic. When the track started going away, I had to get the wing back and that hurt me a little on the bottom. I still felt we were a really good car overall.”

“My car was really good,” said Scelzi. “I had to wait for it to come to me. When I got to the lead...everything was happening so fast, I'm not sure how I got to the lead. Kerry got back underneath me. I didn't feel really great on the bottom or the top. I just didn't really know where to go. Kerry drove a better race with a better car and better driver. Spencer was good too.”

The 18-lap 360 feature was the last preparation for next week's My Place Hotels 360 Knoxville Nationals. Ian Madsen jumped out from his pole position to lead early over Clint Garner and Scelzi. Shane Golobic nabbed fourth from Ryan Giles on lap two, but a good battle saw the latter regain the spot in the low groove on lap three.

Scelzi also used the low line to pass Garner for second on lap four. The leaders entered lapped traffic on lap eight. Scelzi gained quickly on Madsen at that point, and passed him for the lead in heavy traffic on lap nine. Giles worked by Garner for third, and Golobic came on late to gain fourth with three to go.

Up front, Scelzi was hitting on all cylinders and put a straightaway between himself and Madsen by the checkers. Giles maintained third, ahead of Golobic and Garner. Jamie Ball, Kaleb Johnson, Skylar Prochaska, Calving Landis and Michael Faccinto completed the top ten. Sammy Swindell and Giles set quick time in their respective groups, while Golobic, Matt Moro, Johnson and Riley Goodno won heat races. Chase Porter claimed a B main that saw Collin Moyle collect Kade Morton and Mike Johnston on the backstretch. Swindell tipped over after the checkers in the feature. All drivers were uninjured.

“My car felt really good,” said Scelzi in Victory Lane. “I haven’t run a 360 in a long time, and I think that helps you. It just slows you down and makes you hit your marks better. It’s cool to get a win for this team.”

**Sam Hafertepe Jr. Cruises to First Knoxville Win on Night #1 of My Place Hotels 360 Knoxville Nationals Presented by Great Southern Bank!
Shane Golobic is High Point Getter**

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (August 5, 2021) – Sam Hafertepe Jr. couldn't have chosen his first career win at the Knoxville Raceway any better. The Sunnyvale, Texas native won the 20-lap main event on Night #1 of the 31st Annual My Place Hotels 360 Knoxville Nationals Presented by Great Southern Bank in track record time, earning \$3,000 for he and his Hill's Racing #15 team. Fremont, California's Shane Golobic was the night's top point earner heading into Saturday's championship finale.

Garet Williamson led the feature early on, ahead of Matt Juhl, Hafertepe, Lynton Jeffrey and Blake Hahn. Juhl was all over Williamson and passed him to lead lap two, while Golobic entered the top five from his eight place starting spot.

Hafertepe was in “hot pursuit,” and drove under Williamson for second on lap five. He reeled in Juhl and shot by him low in turn two to lead lap seven.

Jeffrey found his way by Williamson on lap nine for third, and the leaders entered lapped traffic on lap 11. Golobic was gaining speed in the closing laps, grabbing fourth on lap 15.

Juhl slid sideways in turn one on lap 16, saving it but losing three positions. Golobic used a lapped car to pass Jeffrey for second, but Hafertepe was slicing through traffic. His 20-lap run of 5:52.2 broke Justin Henderson’s July 18, 2020 track standard by a full five seconds.

Hafertepe Jr. and Golobic were followed by Jeffrey, Williamson and Juhl. Hahn, Brady Bacon, Jamie Ball, Cory Eliason and Justin Henderson rounded out the top ten. Golobic set quick time over the 43-car field, and Brian Brown, Josh Baughman, Derek Hagar, Ryan Leavitt and Jack Dover were heat race winners. Sammy Swindell claimed the B.

Golobic led the point total with 489, followed by Hafertepe Jr. (480), Henderson (470), Jeffrey (469), Juhl (463), Hahn (462), Williamson (460), Jamie Ball (459) and Bacon (453) (full points below).

“I’ve really got to thank Daryl (Turford) on that one,” said Hafertepe in Victory Lane. “He said this race has been won in the middle, and you might want to try it. We were good, and I tried the middle of one and two one time and ‘Oh my!’ I knew we were going to win this thing. We’ve been close to winning here, and to finally win one...it’s awesome! We’ll be starting (Saturday) a little closer to the front than usual. We just don’t race here enough. We race quite a bit compared to some of the other guys. The (locals) know where they need to be, and we’re playing catchup when we come here. It’s awesome to get a hold on it.”

“It’s all about getting yourself situated for Saturday,” said Golobic, who topped the points. “I think we did our job tonight. It’s a cool little family team out here racing with the big dogs, and we had a lot of speed tonight. I’m really excited to come from eighth to second there on a non-stop deal. It’s something we should be proud of.”

“It’s a good old car,” said Jeffrey of his third place mount. “This is the one we won here last year with. We hadn’t got it out until essentially the last week. I think we were a second place car. We just got hung up on a lapped car, and he didn’t know where he was going. It’s just part of it. You have to choose the right lane, and (Golobic) chose the right lane. We actually made contact, so we were lucky to get here.”

Daryn Pittman is Friday's High Point Getter, and Earns Front Row Starting Spot Beside Shane Golobic

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (August 6, 2021) – Gio Scelzi emerged victorious on Night #2 of the 31st Annual My Place Hotels 360 Knoxville Nationals Presented by Great Southern Bank. The Fresno, California native netted \$3,000 aboard the KCP Racing #18 sprinter. Oklahoma's Daryn Pittman was the high point getter in Friday's action and will start beside California's Shane Golobic in Saturday's championship event.

Carson McCarl led early in the 20-lap feature event, ahead of Scott Bogucki, Skylar Prochaska, Scelzi and Terry McCarl. Most action early was back in the pack, where B main winner, Sawyer Phillips, had charged up ten spots in the first six laps.

The leaders entered lapped traffic at the halfway point of the non-stop event, and things got interesting. Prochaska, who had started on the pole, shot under Bogucki into the runner-up position on lap 12. Scelzi also took off about that time, and on lap 13, in heavy lapped traffic, he shot from fourth to second, surviving a close call with Prochaska.

Scelzi suddenly pulled up to the rear bumper of the leader. As McCarl cruised on the low side of one and two, Scelzi chose a line through the middle and shot around to lead lap 19. He pulled away for his second career 360 win here (his first came last Saturday, July 31).

The Fresno, California native's win came aboard the KCP Racing #18 and was put \$15,000 in his coffers.

Daryn Pittman found the low groove to his liking, as he led the 25-lap main event early over Shane Golobic, Scelzi, Clint Garner and Sam Hafertepe Jr. Scelzi worked by Golobic for the runner-up spot on lap two, and Justin Henderson entered the top five.

Henderson continued his climb, passing Garner for fourth on lap five. The South Dakota pair's battle was not over, however, as they traded the spot three times in the next four laps, with Henderson eventually nailing down the spot.

Meanwhile, up front, Scelzi briefly moved by Pittman in turn two for the lead, but surrendered the spot by the checkered flag on lap nine. On lap twelve, several cars in the back were in a gaggle and Brian Brown tipped over. He returned to race, but pulled off shortly after.

Pittman led Scelzi, Golobic, Henderson and Garner back to green. Brooke Tatnell jumped from seventh to fifth on the restart. Henderson shot by Golobic to enter the top three on lap 14, and Tatnell followed him into fourth on lap 17.

Pittman was trailed closely by Scelzi and the last five laps really heated up. Scelzi went through the middle of turn four to edge ahead on lap 23. Pittman stormed back on the bottom to lead at the white flag.

Pittman attempted to steal Scelzi's high groove in one and two. Scelzi went high into turn one, and then turned down to the low side of turn two in what would be a winning diamond move.

Scelzi raced to the checkers ahead of Pittman, Henderson, Golobic and Tatnell. Hafertepe, Garner, Scott Bogucki, Terry McCarl and hard-charger Tyler Courtney rounded out the top ten. Matt Covington started the night out by winning the D main, and Michael Faccinto took the C main. Cory Eliason claimed the B main.

New Jersey's Kyle Reinhardt was the highest finishing Rookie. The Knoxville 360 Booster Club awarded Clint Garner (\$1,000) and Jamie Ball (\$500) as the highest finishing Knoxville 360 regulars. The DGRD Best Appearing Car was the #23K of Rob Kubli (\$360).

"I was running as hard as I could," said Scelzi in Victory Lane. "My car was unbelievable. I love Bernie (Stuebgen). I can't believe it. To win a crown jewel like this is unbelievable. I love this place. Pittman was so good on the bottom, I just never gave up. He's such a smart racer. He broke my momentum going into one, and luckily I could drive back underneath him."

"We just got beat," said Pittman. "Those are hard to take as a driver. I thought we were good. (Gio) has been phenomenal since last week when he won here, and he unloaded and ran really well. To get that close and let it go on the last lap is tough. This team works really hard and we've been getting better. I'm having fun driving the car. Congratulations to Gio and the whole KCP team. I've got to give it to him. I think the bottom was the preferred line and he drove by me. I fully expected him to come across my nose and he didn't. He ran his line and flat beat me clean."

"We started eighth and had a quality racecar," said the third place Henderson. "The motor was running really well, and it got a little hot under the red and spit out a bunch of water, but this is the 360 Nationals and we wanted to win. Congratulations to Gio, and good job to Daryn Pittman, but if we had started a few rows farther up, we might have had something. Eighth to third is nothing to kick the dirt about, and we're really proud of this team."

“We felt good here,” said Gravel in Victory Lane. “I feel like I’m pretty good around the bottom, and that was the best groove tonight. I kind of screwed up in that Pole Shuffle, but I knew if I started up front, I was going to have a chance. It felt good passing Donny, and Cory was really fast. Once I was able to get by (lapped car) Paul McMahan there, and kind of get some clear track. I just thought the bottom was the dominant place, and I felt if I went high, I was leaving the door open for someone else.”

David Gravel Continues Knoxville Roll in Nationals Opener!

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (August 11, 2021) – David Gravel continued his momentum as he won the 60th NOS Energy Drink Knoxville Nationals BRANDT Professional Agriculture Qualifying Night at Knoxville Raceway Wednesday. The Watertown, Connecticut driver made it two in a row at Knoxville after winning Sunday's Fatheadz Eyewear Capitani Classic Presented by Great Southern Bank. The driver of the Big Game Motorsports #2 earned \$12,000 for his tenth career win here. Gio Scelzi emerged as the high point driver on the night (complete points below).

Zeb Wise had the lead on lap one, but by only .008 of a second over Justin Henderson. Henderson moved into the lead on lap two, as Wise, Gravel, Peck and Josh Baughman followed. Gravel used the low side to dispose of Wise for the runner-up spot on lap four, as Scelzi entered the top four. On lap six, Scelzi slid in front of Wise in three and four to take third.

Henderson entered lapped traffic two laps before Wise slowed with a rear-end issue nine laps in. The only restart of the race saw Henderson leading Gravel, Scelzi, Peck and James McFadden.

Donny Schatz entered the top five on lap 13, while Henderson maintained his lead heading back into traffic on lap 17. Schatz gained fourth from Peck with five to go.

Up front, Gravel was gaining on Henderson, who slid in front of a lapper. On lap 22, Gravel cruised on the low side to take the lead with three to go.

Gravel's win came ahead of Scelzi, who gained second on the white flag lap, Schatz who made a last corner pass for third, Henderson and Peck. Sheldon Haudenschild, hard-charger Logan Schuchart, McFadden, Cory Eliason and Spencer Bayston rounded out the top ten. Brooke Tatnell set quick time over the 49-car field, while Josh Schneiderman, Kyle Reinhardt, Riley Goodno, Jake Bubak and Ayrton Gennetten won heats. Tanner Carrick won the C main, and Schuchart claimed the B.

"This car is bad," said Gravel in Victory Lane. "I'm ready for Saturday. That was a fast paced race. It was wide open on the top. It was starting to get tricky at the end, and that's why I kind of pulled the trigger on Justin. It started to curb up, and my wing was starting to go back by itself. It just got a little tight at the end. (Henderson) kind of pulled away from me on the restart, and he slid that lapped car and that broke his momentum. I was able to stick the bottom of one and two."

"I'm not sure how much I did," said Scelzi. "This car pretty much drives itself around this racetrack. It was an awesome racetrack. I've never seen it not build a cushion like that. These guys have nailed the racetrack through the 360's and the Cappy."

"We could have got there," said Schatz about his pursuit of the win. "Twenty-five laps is a lot shorter than it's going to be come Saturday. We got rolling at the end. Man, you change one thing and you end up changing ten. You try to make a step in a certain direction and you take a step back. That's what these prelim nights are for. We'll have a couple days to let the masterminds come up with a plan. We'll be there."

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (August 12, 2021) – Brian Brown survived 60th NOS Energy Drink Knoxville Nationals Presented by Casey’s Wolfe Eye Clinic Qualifying Night, garnering his 55th career win at the Knoxville Raceway. The win aboard the Brian Brown Racing #21 paid the Grain Valley, Missouri driver \$12,000. The main event saw a number of cars eliminated early, but Brown persevered for his third career preliminary night win at the Nationals.

Before a lap could be completed, two cars were eliminated. First, Shane Stewart exited with mechanical problems, and on the second try, Parker Price-Miller jumped the right rear tire of TJ Stutts and took a wild ride

off the turn one fence. He was not seriously injured. Stutts replaced his tire, and Ian Madsen, who also caught the incident, changed a top wing.

Sam Hafertepe Jr. led lap one from the pole, ahead of Brown, Brent Marks, Sye Lynch and Paul McMahan. Carnage ensued on the second circuit, when Carson Macedo clipped the inside berm in turn three, washed up the track, and collected Paul McMahan. Both cars flipped, with McMahan's bursting into flames. The driver was quickly out and the safety crew on the scene in good time. McMahan was taken in for observation. The incident also collected Kerry Madsen, Sawyer Phillips, Sammy Swindell and Marcus Dumesny. Only Phillips and Swindell would continue.

Brown shot to the lead on the restart, while Tyler Courtney and Rico Abreu moved into fourth and fifth. Marks shot by Hafertepe for second on lap three. Abreu and Courtney battled for the fourth spot, and Brad Sweet entered the fray as well. Contact between Sweet and Courtney resulted in the latter's rear bumper being knocked off and causing a caution for debris seven laps in.

Brown led Marks, Hafertepe, Abreu and Courtney back to green. Courtney shot by Abreu on lap eight to reclaim fourth, while Sweet and Larson moved into fifth and sixth. Larson jumped up to fifth on lap 11, before Swindell stopped top bring a caution.

Larson used the restart to move into fourth, and Sweet followed him into fifth. The pair claimed third and fourth on lap 13, when Courtney slowed and exited.

The last twelve laps went smoothly for Brown, who entered lapped traffic with seven to go. Larson was able to get by Marks on lap 15 for second, but never seriously mounted a challenge to the leader.

Following Brown and Larson were Marks, Sweet and Abreu. Kasey Kahne, Austin McCarl, Ian Madsen, Kraig Kinser and Sye Lynch rounded out the top ten. After a rain delay of almost an hour and a half, Brown set quick time over the 48-car field. Swindell, Sawyer Phillips, Greg Wilson, Skylar Prochaska and Dumesny won heat races. Jack Dover won the C main and Larson claimed the B. Cale Thomas had a mechanical break that caused him to crash in his heat. He was unhurt.

Gio Scelzi and Sweet (high point driver on Thursday) will share the front row for Saturday's championship event (full combined points below).

"The 'GOAT' was lurking," said Brown of Larson's pursuit. "On the first melee, when I heard he was eleventh, I thought that was a lot of cars in one lap. Then I saw, fifth, third and then second. I was going to run the wheels off this thing. It's been so long since I've been in contention for Saturday night. I wanted to get that race going. I couldn't get going very well, but I didn't have to work too hard in traffic."

"We'll call it tenth to second," said Larson, who started 21st, but was aided by some competitors being eliminated in incidents. "I was lucky enough to have some holes to idle through it. The night obviously turned out a lot better than I thought it would. I thought I had the bottom of three and four going well. I made too many mistakes to really challenge Brown. He did a good job and didn't make any mistakes out there. We salvaged a great point night and I think we'll be starting in the second row for Saturday."

"I generally struggle here," said Marks of his previous Knoxville runs. "I seem to race o.k., but we always seem to start deep in the field. We put a whole night together, and the car was really good. We came here with something totally different than what I usually do, and made a lot of changes after the Cappy on Sunday. I'm proud of what we were able to accomplish."

Rico Abreu Wins; Anthony Macri, Shane Stewart and Brock Zearfoss Also Qualify for Knoxville Nationals Finale!

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (August 13, 2021) – Rico Abreu was the class of the field on FVP “Hard Knox” Night Friday at the 60th NOS Energy Knoxville Nationals Presented by Casey’s. Rico’s third career win at Knoxville Raceway was his second on Friday night of the Nationals. The win gave the St. Helena, California native a

starting spot in Saturday night's championship event. He will be joined by top four finishers Anthony Macri, Shane Stewart (his 20th straight final) and Brock Zearfoss. The top four all also earned \$4,000 for their finishes.

Clint Garner's feature came to a halt before it began with an oil tank issue. Jac Haudenschild was a popular early leader in his last Nationals, while Abreu, Kyle Reinhardt, Macri and Zearfoss chased him. By lap three, Macri was by Reinhardt for third.

Abreu tracked down his teammate and passed him for the lead low in turn four on the sixth lap. Macri followed him into second two laps later. The only caution of the race came eleven laps in, when Ayrton Gennetten stopped with suspension issues while running thirteenth.

Abreu led Macri, Haudenschild, Reinhardt and Zearfoss back to green flag racing. Stewart, who started eleventh shot from sixth to the fourth and final transfer in Saturday's championship on lap 13, taking that spot from Reinhardt.

Lapped traffic began to factor with six to go, and Stewart continued his climb by taking third from Haudenschild on lap 21. Zearfoss was also on a roll, and passed Jac on the backstretch with just two laps to go to garner the highly important fourth position.

Stewart shot by Macri for second on the white flag lap, but the Dillsburg, Pennsylvania driver gained it back on the final lap. Following Abreu, Macri, Stewart and Zearfoss was Scott Bogucki, who will start 11th in Saturday's B main. Haudenschild, Shane Golobic, Bill Balog, Reinhardt and Lynton Jeffrey rounded out the top ten. Daryn Pittman and Abreu set quick time in their respective groups atop the 69-car field. Stewart, Balog, Josh Schneiderman, McKenna Haase, Wayne Johnson and Davey Heskin won the heats. Pittman and Sammy Swindell won B mains.

"My guys worked so hard," said Abreu, who was in Victory Lane for the first time this year. "It's just a matter of time before things start clicking. As a team owner running two cars with Jac, and seeing all the important memories he's been creating this year, being on the front row together is pretty special. It's just great momentum. We've been to Knoxville four times this year, and we haven't been outside the top five."

"I'm ecstatic!" said Macri of his second place run. "I'm speechless. There before the feature, I could of puked. This is honestly a dream come true. We had to wait until Friday to put it in the show, but we're in the show. This is unreal."

"We're very happy to get this car in the show," said Stewart. "I was a little worried starting eleventh. I knew I was going to have my work cut out for me, but the car was really good. I gained a few spots on the first lap, which is so crucial with the crowd we're running with these days. We searched for speed all week. I felt good in my heat race tonight, and we fine-tuned it from there. I felt the yellow came out at the right time for me, and I regained my composure from there."

"(Starting) last or not, it doesn't matter," said Zearfoss. "You're in the show. The only way to go is forward now. That track was technical. There was a big hole in the middle of three. You just had to drive through it if you were up there, and the bottom was super-thin. I had three tires up on the berm there in the middle of the race just trying to make traction. Shane got by us, and that made my job a little tougher. I don't know, I just got up in the seat a little more and this is awesome. Two Knoxville Nationals in three attempts is pretty cool."

Kyle Larson Achieves His Dream with Knoxville Nationals Win! by Bill Wright

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (August 14, 2021) – Kyle Larson has dreamed of a Knoxville Nationals title his whole life, and that dream was realized in the 60th NOS Energy Drink Knoxville Nationals Presented by Casey's championship Saturday night at the Knoxville Raceway. Including lap money, the Elk Grove, California native earned \$176,000 for his ride aboard the Paul Silva #57.

The 50-lap finale saw pole-sitter, Gio Scelzi, lead early over Donny Schatz, Larson, David Gravel and Brad Sweet. The recently reworked track was very good in the bottom groove, and Scelzi shot into lapped traffic on the seventh circuit.

Larson rode low to pass Schatz for second on the same lap, and Sweet moved by Gravel for fourth on lap nine. Schatz would catch fire at that point, however, getting back by Larson on the low side for second on lap ten and carrying his momentum to take the lead from Scelzi on lap 11.

Larson followed him by Scelzi to take second on lap 13, as the leaders cruised behind traffic. Nearing the halfway mark, Gravel and Sweet battled for fourth, with Brent Marks close behind.

Up front, Larson rode the cushion around Schatz to lead lap 25. Schatz came right back on the 27th lap and rode the cushion to retake the lead in turn two. The pass was negated when the mandatory pit stop yellow flag was thrown.

With 24 laps to go, Larson led the pack ahead of Schatz, Scelzi, Gravel and Marks. Rico Abreu spun when a group of cars in front of him tangled. He pulled in shortly thereafter. On lap 29, Brian Brown jumped the turn one cushion, getting upside down. The incident collected Tyler Courtney and Cory Eliason. Brock Zearfoss suffered damage, and Sheldon Haudenschild flattened a right rear, but both restarted at the tail.

Gravel grabbed third from Scelzi on the restart, and Sweet followed him into fourth on lap 31. At that point, Gravel's mount went up in smoke and pulled to the infield.

Larson built a lead over Schatz out front as rubber began to develop a car length down from the cushion. Eventually, the groove moved down low on the track, and Schatz reeled in the leader. He appeared to be faster in three, and threw the Tony Stewart Racing #15 a little higher to attempt a pass that fell short. One more try on the white flag lap also failed to work.

Larson's win came ahead of Schatz, who earned \$89,000 counting his lap money. Sweet, Scelzi and Logan Schuchart followed. Marks, James McFadden, Kasey Kahne, Carson Macedo and hard-charger Sheldon Haudenschild rounded out the top ten. Jason Sides won the E main, Jack Dover claimed the D main, and Hunter Schuereberg took the C main.

Macedo won a 22-lap B main that saw a three-way battle for the final transfer. Behind Macedo and Kerry Madsen, Cory Eliason, Sheldon Haudenschild and Spencer Bayston came to the line together. Haudenschild finished in the final transfer just .008 of a second ahead of Bayston for the final transfer.

Several awards were handed out during the night as well (complete list below).

"Gosh, I've always dreamed of winning this race," said an emotional Larson in Victory Lane. "This atmosphere this week was unbelievable. I think a year off last year made the roof explode! I felt the energy all week, and that kept me pumped up. Honestly, this is as nervous as I've been leading up to a race in a couple of years. I had butterflies all day today. During Cup practice (at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway), it was all I could think about. (Owner/Crew Chief) Paul Silva is the best there is. I wanted to get the lead before the halfway point. I looked at the board and I knew we were coming down to the end of it. I decided to blitz it, and I pulled it off. (Schatz) actually got back by me before that caution came out. After the yellows, I just didn't know what to do. I was watching the big screen and it was taking rubber. I got behind Shane (Stewart) and I kind of settled in. I could see Donny was taking huge chunks out of my lead lap after lap. He was on my rear bumper and I just told myself, 'I know he's here, just don't miss it.' It was great to beat Donny here for the Nationals. He beat me a few years ago, and he's the best there is."

"I gave it everything I had," said Schatz. "I was kind of surprised when the racetrack changed like that, but it did. We just had to change with it. I seen (Larson) get to the bottom, and I thought there was no way there was rubber down there. Sure enough, it was kind of chalked up. I got closer to him and the laps wound down. I thought the lapped car was going to hold him up so I smoked it up into three. I gave it the old 'Hail Mary!' It didn't quite come out in the spot I wanted. It's good to come here and have a decent run. Kyle's been knocking on the door of this forever, and he's definitely a 'one-off' talent. If we ever see anything like that in our lifetime again, I guess it will be pretty rare. It feels good to be back here with all the fans."

"I gave a little too much track position the first 25 laps," said Sweet. "I didn't get a very good start and the track was a little crumbly up top after the track rework. We had to work our way back up there, and once we got to third, I felt we could pace Donny. Kyle was kind of out. We searched the racetrack and found some rubber in spots. Luckily, we brought it home third and we can't complain. Hat's off to Kyle and Donny. I felt like we had a really good car. It was just going to be tough driving up by Donny and Kyle."

The crowd had a chance to say their good-byes to Jac Haudenschild who is retiring from his Hall of Fame career after this season. He was serenaded on both the front and backstretch. His night ended in the B main.

A pair of incidents happened before the 25-lap 410 feature could fire off. A Ben Brown spin slowed things. Once green, front row starters, Sawyer Phillips and Justin Henderson, who came in second in points, collided in turn three, ending both their nights.

The incident moved pole-sitter Gio Scelzi and Brown to the front row. With Heskin now starting eleventh, Brown needed to beat him by five spots. Scelzi stormed out to the lead, but shortly after entering lapped traffic, he broke a rear axle six laps in.

Brown assumed the lead ahead of Ayrton Gennetten, Don Droud Jr., Matt Juhl and Sam Hafertepe Jr. One eye was on Heskin, who restarted ninth. Juhl moved into third, and Terry McCarl entered the top five on the restart. McCarl continued his climb by grabbing fourth on lap eight.

Brown entered lapped traffic on the thirteenth circuit, and Heskin was moving up. Using the low side of the track, he moved his way up to sixth, just one spot from his goal. On lap 17, the crowd erupted when he shot under Sam Hafertepe Jr. for fifth.

Up front, Brown was flawless before Droud stopped in turn four with four to go. Heskin would gain an insurance spot, driving by Juhl for fourth, and winning his first track championship.

Brown's 56th win paid him \$5,000 and put him just one victory behind Steve Kinser for fourth on the all-time win list at Knoxville. Gennetten ran a strong second, ahead of McCarl, Heskin and Juhl. Roger Crockett, Austin McCarl, Josh Schneiderman, Dylan Westbrook and Tasker Phillips rounded out the top ten. Henderson set quick time, while Schneiderman, Brown and Scelzi won the heats. Dustin Selvage claimed the B main.

"This car was good all night long," said Brown in Victory Lane. "It's good to be back home. I was hoping it was going to be pretty exciting there with me and Justin trying to race for a championship. He just got racing hard, and I luckily snuck by there. Congratulations to (Davey) and his team. They did a phenomenal job. They are what sprint car racing is. He, his brother, and grandpa. Anytime you can win at Knoxville, it's always good. No one can say they won the last one until April again. It's an honor to race here, and be a part of Knoxville."

"There's just no words," said an emotional Heskin addressing his track championship. "I thought we were goners after the time trial (he entered with a 78-point lead on Henderson and 86 point lead on Brown, who registered quick time and second quick, respectively). I really thought I cut a good lap. When I got up to fifth

and got past Sam, I thought ‘Alright, let’s get the wing back and let’s go!’ I can’t thank my family and friends enough. I still don’t know what to say, it’s so special. I just can’t believe it. This is why we travel five hours to race here. We earned that one!”

The 360 class also saw a three-way battle coming in, with Ryan Giles just needing a solid night in the top ten for a title. Austin Miller and Kaleb Johnson contacted on the first try at green in the 20-lap main event, and on the second run, Miller flipped in turn one, collecting Mike Johnston. It was a rough night for Miller, who also had an accident after the checkers of his heat. Collin Moyle spun on the third try at green, before things actually got going.

Joe Beaver led Jamie Ball, Christian Bowman, Giles and Garner early on. Bogucki shot by Garner for fifth on lap two, before Bowman went up in smoke in the third spot.

Ball used the restart to storm to the lead, while Giles also got by Beaver for the second spot on lap five. The leaders hit lapped traffic on lap nine, but with seven to go, Giles, who seemed to be cruising to his first championship, lost power with seven to go.

Ball led the field back to green, ahead of Beaver, Bogucki, Garner and Moro. Beaver retook the lead on lap 14, but Ball slid back by in one and two, to reclaim it. Bogucki was on the move however, getting by Beaver on the low side and then passing Ball high in turn four to take the point with four to go.

Garner shot under Beaver, who had made contact with Ball in his battle for the lead, to claim the third spot, and seal a championship by just 17 points over Ball in the final standings.

Bogucki’s second win paid him \$2,000. Ball followed the Aussie across the finish line, ahead of Garner, Josh Higday and Calvin Landis. Riley Goodno, Moro, Ryan Leavitt, Christopher Thram and Gunner Ramey completed the top ten. Garner set quick time over the field, with Bowman, Landis and Higday winning heats.

“I was starting to fade pretty bad getting free,” said Bogucki in Victory Lane. “It actually got slicker than we anticipated. I saw they were getting stuck in traffic, and I’d been pretty committed to the bottom. I thought I’d just stay around the top. I led three of these this year and they got away from me. I wasn’t going to let it happen this time. Jamie is a first class racer, and you can run side by side with him. It was a lot of fun.”

“The older I get, the more I understand you are just along for the ride,” said Garner of his ninth career 360 track title. “Coming in 80 points behind, I told everybody there’s no way. We’ll just do our best and see how it plays out. Ryan had it under control if his engine wouldn’t have let loose on him. I think we’d have ran second to him. We just got lucky, I guess. My age helps. I make sure I don’t put myself in predicaments that take me out of races. You’ve got to finish the race. It takes a lot of stuff to make it all happen.”

It was clear sailing for Tyler Groenendyk in the Pace Performance Pro Sprints 18-lap feature. Chase Young was running second when he flipped after hitting the turn three infield berm on lap two. The rest of the race went uninterrupted, with Groenendyk sailing away to a straightaway lead on lap seven.

Groenendyk navigated traffic well the last five circuits took his fourth win of the season and his first track title. Matthew Stelzer, Jeff Wilke, Mike Mayberry and Eric Bridger followed. Devin Wignall, Tyler Barrick, JJ Beaver, Joel Thorpe and Matt Allen rounded out the top ten. Mayberry and Bridger won the heats.

“This is unbelievable,” said Groenendyk of both the feature and his track title. “To do what we’ve done this year is incredible, and it really has to do with all the people surrounding us and behind us. I’ve got a lot of laps around here, but it had been a couple of years. This is an accumulation of that knowledge I had and having the great racecars we’ve had here. I told the guys before tonight, that we finally had a night with no pressure. Then, the invert put us on the pole, so then we had to win the race. We came out on top so it’s all good.”

Tyler Erb Jets to Second Career Win at Knoxville on Night #1 of Lucas Oil Late Model Knoxville Nationals!

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (September 16, 2021) – Tyler Erb took the lead early and drove to his second career win at the Knoxville Raceway in Thursday’s night #1 of the 17th Lucas Oil Late Model Knoxville Nationals presented by BRANDT Professional Agriculture. The New Waverly, Texas driver was paid \$7,000 for his win.

Ricky Weiss, who became the first Canadian late model winner at Knoxville two years ago, led lap one of the 25-lap main event ahead of Erb, Jonathan Davenport, Tyler Bruening and Tim McCreadie.

Erb shot to the point on lap two and rode the low side of the half-mile out front. McCreadie would move by Bruening on lap eight for fourth, and Kyle Larson would follow into the top five on lap 13.

The leaders hit lapped traffic on the fourteenth circuit. Two laps later, Davenport found his way by Weiss for second. At that point, Chris Simpson slowed, bringing a caution. Erb led Davenport, Weiss, McCreadie and Larson back to green.

Larson shot by McCreadie for fourth on the cushion before Mike Marljar stopped and exited with six laps to go. Erb continued to lead after the restart over Davenport, while Larson worked his way by Weiss for the third spot.

A final restart occurred after Hudson O'Neal and Logan Martin contacted hard in turn four with two to go, bringing out the red flag. Both drivers were uninjured.

Erb cruised the final two laps to win over Davenport, Larson, Weiss and Kyle Strickler. McCreadie, Earl Pearson Jr., Bruening, Chad Simpson and Brandon Sheppard rounded out the top ten. Strickler and Larson set quick time in their respective groups, while Chase Junghans, McCreadie, Weiss, Erb, O'Neal and Josh Richards won heat races. Ricky Thornton Jr. and Shane Clanton claimed the B mains.

Larson was the high point man on the night, but will leave town for his NASCAR obligations. Erb, McCreadie, Strickler and Weiss followed him in points. Drivers will use their top point night between Thursday and Friday to set up Saturday's lineup (full points below).

"Three years ago, I won my first National race here," said Erb in Victory Lane. "To win tonight again is awesome. Racing is so up and down. (Davenport and Larson) are at the top of their game. What a lot of people don't see from the outside, is this day and age, if your car is bad, you're bad. We've been working to make our car better. They are two of the best drivers right now in their craft, and it feels good to beat them."

"We weren't that good really," said Davenport. "We were a whole lot better than we normally are here though. We're learning and we're going to keep our heads up. My crew gave me the best car they could. I don't know what to tell them, because I'm not that comfortable yet. We'll try to get one spot better tomorrow. We know some areas we need to work on."

"I was really good in the mid-portions of that," said Larson. "I started catching some lapped traffic and then the caution came out. I think we needed to stay green and we would have had a better shot. I just struggled on the restarts in these things, and it takes me a couple laps to get my momentum up. After a couple laps, we were able to get going. I just made some mistakes on the cushion and that cost me some time. I'm just happy I got to run at least one night. It was cool to run something completely different here."

**Terbo Charged! Tyler Erb Wins for Second Night in a Row at Lucas Oil Late Model Knoxville Nationals

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (September 17, 2021) – Tyler Erb topped the podium for the second night in a row at the Lucas Oil Late Model Knoxville Nationals Presented by BRANDT Professional Agriculture. The New Waverly, Texas driver took the lead early for the second night in a row and was never seriously challenged. His win was worth \$7,000, and was his third at the famous Knoxville Raceway. Tim McCreddie emerged as the top point man, and will start on the pole of Saturday's 100-lap \$50,000 to win championship event. The top 24 in points locked themselves into the finale (lineups below).

Brandon Sheppard led the 25-lap main event early over Tyler Bruening, Erb, Shannon Babb and Mike Marlar. Erb shot from third to first to lead lap three and never looked back. Bruening moved into second early, while Marlar took over fourth on lap eight.

Kyle Strickler moved into the top five by the eleventh lap. The leader entered lapped traffic with eight to go. Shortly after, Logan Martin slowed, bringing out the first caution of the feature. On the restart, Sheppard

claimed second from Bruening and Tim McCreadie moved into the top five. McCreadie climbed to fourth with six to go, right before Strickler tagged the turn three wall while running sixth.

Erb pulled away again on the restart, and survived a third one for a stopped Shannon Babb with two to go. Following Erb across the line were Sheppard, Bruening, McCreadie and Marlal. Ricky Thornton Jr., Jimmy Owens, Hudson O'Neal, Kyle Bronson and Frank Heckenast Jr. rounded out the top ten. Jonathan Davenport and Tad Pospisil set quick time in their respective groups. Davenport, Sheppard, Owens, Heckenast, Shane Clanton and McCreadie won heats. Hudson O'Neal and Logan Martin claimed the B mains.

"You never want to see a caution at the end like that, but we ran well enough last night that I didn't want to commit myself to run the cushion," said Erb in Victory Lane. "I could tell somebody was getting a good run on the outside and I figured it was Shepp, but if I stayed on the inside of three and drove across it was going to be hard to get by me. I'm pumped to win here. I have a great car and a great crew. Racing is really fun when you have a great car and you can kind of maneuver. Once I got out front, I could set my pace and I felt the longer we went green the better I'd get."

"I was good for a lap or two on the restarts, and then he would run away from me there," said Sheppard of Erb. "He did a really good job. He's been tough all weekend, and he's going to be tough to beat tomorrow for sure. It was definitely a wild night for us. Thanks to everyone who helped us get back in the heat race. There's a lot of good guys in this pit area."

"I heard Brandon say he was good for a couple of laps after those restarts, and I felt the same way," said Bruening. "I think Tyler was just a little bit better than everyone tonight and he deserved the win. We were super good tonight. The car has been good all weekend and I think we have something for them in that 100 laps tomorrow night."

**Mike Marlar Cashes in \$50,000 As First Three-Time Lucas Oil Late Model Knoxville Nationals Winner!
Tad Pospisil wins SLMR Series Bob Marschmann Memorial

KNOXVILLE, Iowa (September 18, 2021) – Mike Marlar earned his third career Lucas Oil Late Model Knoxville Nationals crown at the Knoxville Raceway Saturday night. The Winfield, Tennessee driver has won the last three Nationals he has entered at Knoxville. This one was worth \$50,000. In support action, Tad Pospisil won the SLMR Series Bob Marschmann Memorial.

Tim McCreadie led early in the 100-lapper over Thursday and Friday prelims winner Tyler Erb, Marlar, Kyle Strickler and Brandon Sheppard. By lap six, Sheppard and Earl Pearson Jr. had gotten by Strickler into fourth and fifth. McCreadie entered lapped traffic on the eighth circuit.

On lap 11, Erb worked the low side of turn four to pass McCreadie and take the point. Pearson passed Sheppard for fourth six laps later. The first caution of the event came on lap 21, when Jonathan Davenport slowed while running tenth.

Marlar snatched second from McCreadie on the restart, and six more laps ticked off before Tad Pospisil and Jeremiah Hurst came together in turn two to bring another caution. On lap 29, McCreadie worked back by Marlar for the second spot. Ricky Weiss moved into the top five on lap 35, by getting by Sheppard.

Erb was back in lapped traffic on lap 39, but would slow a lap later with rear-end issues, handing the lead back to McCreadie. At that point, a competition red allowed teams to refuel. Erb's team also had time to make repairs and return their driver to the tail of the field.

Marlar surged on the restart, claiming the lead and setting a good pace. By lap 52, he was back into traffic and had a near miss, but kept the point. Weiss claimed third from Pearson on lap 53, in a battle that lasted most of the second half of the race. Hudson O'Neal entered the top five on lap 59, and Erb was up from the tail to the top ten by lap 63. Pearson passed Weiss again for third on lap 66, and Erb was into seventh by lap 72.

Ricky Thornton Jr. was running a strong sixth when he slowed with a flat tire with 26 laps to go, bringing the final caution. Marlar shot back out to the lead, while Erb moved into the top five trailing Marlar, McCreadie, Pearson and Weiss. Weiss and Pearson exchanged third four more times over the final laps.

Up front, McCreadie stayed with Marlar. In traffic, McCreadie shot by to take the lead back on lap 89, but Marlar would return the favor down the backstretch a lap later.

Marlar's fifth victory overall at Knoxville would ultimately come ahead of McCreadie, Weiss, Pearson and Sheppard, who grabbed fifth on the last lap. Erb, O'Neal, hard-charger Josh Richards, Chris Simpson and Chad Simpson rounded out the top ten. Tony Jackson Jr. and Ryan Gustin won B mains.

"The car was really good, and once I got out in clean air, it was really, really good," said Marlar in Victory Lane. "My guys helped me get it tuned in really good this week. It was an awesome race. It was fun racing there with Timmy. He had me on pins and needles at the end of that thing. Once you lose your air here, you're in trouble. We had some cars in front of us congesting things. Timmy's a professional's professional. He raced me clean as he could without wrecking us both. We made it through it ok. We've had so much success here, even before we started winning. I feel for Tyler (Erb). He was going for something awesome here (a sweep). We talk about Knoxville a lot, and he's starting to master it, so I hate that for him. It was a fun race, and it's hard to think about winning at a big race like this."

"I've been bad here for about a decade, so hat's off to the crew," said McCreadie, who was paid \$25,000 for second. "We put a bunch of stuff together that I hadn't run in a while and ran good last night. We went back to that, and I had a feeling the top was going to be good for a little while. If I could do it over, I would have slid myself into three. Hat's off to Mikie. He gave it a good shot there. For everyone on this team, it was a lot of fun

out there. I hate it for Tyler, he probably had the best car out there. We're not disappointed tonight. I gave it all I had."

"We got better after the fuel stop there," said Weiss, who earned \$10,000 for third. "It took about seven laps and the tires took off again and we were rolling. We were really good with about 20 to go, and I was trying to run them down there. I was slicing and dicing with the lapped cars, and it was a heck of a show from what I saw. Hat's off to my guys who work so hard on this car."

Tad Pospisil Takes Bob Marschmann Memorial

Norfolk, Nebraska's Tad Pospisil won his second career feature at Knoxville with a flag to flag performance in the 22-lap Super Late Model Racing Series Bob Marschmann Memorial. Pospisil picked up \$4,000 for his win.

Pospisil led from the outset from his starting spot outside the front row. Andy Eckrich trailed, ahead of Bill Leighton Jr., Dave Eckrich, Josh Leonard and Kyle Berck. Chad Holladay was on a roll on lap six, moving all the way up to fourth.

Up front, Pospisil entered lapped traffic on lap nine. Two laps later, Berck advanced from sixth to fourth. Berck looked strong but went up in smoke with four to go.
